GDC Vision Statement

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Perspective

- Nationally:
 - 1 in 31 is under some form of correctional control
- Georgia:
 - 1 in 13 is under some form of correctional control (first in the nation)
 - Georgia ranks:
 - First in the nation with 1 in 15 under some form of community supervision.
 - Forth in the nation in adult incarceration at the rate of 1 in 70.

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Innovative Solutions

Intent—Purpose

To plan, implement and sustain *the exceptional statewide felony probation operation in the nation* by implementing best practices including strategies, methods, interventions, partnerships and technologies that are proven to reduce recidivism; thereby, maximizing public safety while continuing to practice sound public stewardship principles.



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Background

- In 2006 The PEW Center on States launched the Public Safety Performance Project (PSPP) to help states advance fiscally sound, data-driven policies and practices in sentencing and corrections that protect public safety, hold offenders accountable, and control correctional costs.
- The 2008 Pew Center Public Safety Policy Brief Putting Public Safety First recommended specific strategies for accomplishing successful supervision and reentry thereby reducing recidivism.
- > March, 2009 PEW Report released:

"One in 31: The Long Reach of American Corrections"



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Method

- In March 2009, Commissioner Owens directed Probation Operations to develop a concept for planning, implementing and sustaining the exceptional statewide felony probation operation in the nation:
 - Implementation plans should leverage "best practices" including strategies, methods, interventions, partnerships and technology.
 - A total of 10 steps were developed shaping the overall Mission and Vision of Probation Operations.
 Process Action Teams were formed to address these steps/initiatives.



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Ten Step Framework

- Sort offenders by risk to public safety and identify top 25 geographic probation hotspots
- Identify and create community partnerships to reduce recidivism (CIP)
- 3. Base intervention programs on science (DRC and MH)
- Design GDC Sentencing Model that leverages Specialty Courts
- Utilize technology that improves efficiencies in probation supervision and enhances public safety
- Impose swift, certain, and proportionate sanctions
- Create incentives for success (offenders and officers)
- Create seamless transition from prison to probation Measure progress through Accountability, Over Communication and Teamwork
- 10. Identify legislation that will enhance public safety in an efficient manner



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COMPARISON & CORRELATION

- ☐ Focus on higher risk offenders / assess need and risk
- ☐ Use incentives and rewards / Implement earned discharge
- ☐ Tailor probation conditions
- ☐ Frontload supervision resources ☐ Balance surveillance and treatment
- $\hfill \square$ Involve offenders in the process
- ☐ Supervise offenders in their communities / engage informal social controls / engage partners, expand intervention
- Respond to violations with swift, certain sanctions
- Define success as recidivism reduction

✓ Offenders to be sorted by risk

- Incentives (rewards) for success to be implemented
- Design sentencing model / enable seamless transition (prison to probation) to include stringent conditions upon release
- Community partnerships to be created
- Intervention to be "evidenced-based"
- Impose swift, certain, proportionate sanctions
- ✓ Measure progress (A.C.T.)



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PEW Strategy

Supervise Offenders In Their Communities

GDC Step #1 **Sort offenders**

by public safety risk & Identify top 25 geographic hotspots

- Sort offenders by highest risk in each judicial circuit
- Identify and sort top 25 geographic (circuit and zip code) probation hotspots according to highest risk

Engage Partners To Expand Intervention Capacity

Engage Informal Social Controls

GDC Step #2

Identify and create community partnerships to reduce

recidivism

- Develop framework for expansion of Community Impact Program (CIP) model within geographic areas with the highest risk offenders
- Develop community liaisons within each circuit to provide support measures to reduce recidivism



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PEW Strategy

Focus Resources on High Risk Offenders

GDC Step #3

Base intervention programs on science

(Day Reporting Center and Mental Health)

- Identify Evidence Based Programs currently utilized with Probation Operations Identify community based programs within Probation Operations Identify any non-research intervention programs currently being utilized within Probation Operations
- Identify Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselors within Probation Operations



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

GDC Step #4

Design GDC Sentencing Model that Leverages Specialty Courts

- Design progressive sentencing system incorporating specialty courts and GDC alternatives
- Identify Specialty Courts currently in place statewide
- Identify probation operations participation in Specialty Courts statewide

Respond to Violations with Swift and Certain Sanctions

GDC Step #6 Impose swift, certain, and

proportionate sanctions

- Expand POM (Probation Options Management) statewide by controlled, systematic implementation and growth Identify circuits utilizing waivers and other sentencing options that address violations in an expeditious manner
- Identify best practices developed statewide imposing swift, certain and proportionate sanctions



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PEW Strategy

GDC Step #7

Use Incentives and Rewards

Create Incentives for Success (Officers and Offenders)

- Establish measurable criteria for achievement of exceptional performance by officer and offender Identify methods to acknowledge and reward offender and staff achievement by rewarding excellence in performance
- Develop suitable rewards and incentives for meeting the criteria for exceptional performance



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PEW Strategy

GDC Step #8

Create seamless transition from prison to probation

- Frontload Supervision Resources

- Push notification of release date to CPO 90 days prior to release Strengthen supervision requirements 120 days post release Enhance communication by creating and modifying offender pre-release policy for facility counselors to include contacting probation officer

 - Fully implement strategies outlined by the PEW Center (10 Step Framework)
 - Set the national standard for probation supervision
 - Show a measured, marked reduction in recidivism within the prison and probation populations.
