4-H Resumes

A. General Rules for Submitting 4-H Resumes

- 1. 4-H members submitting resumes must have actively been enrolled in 4-H during the current 4-H year.
- 2. All 4-H resumes are due in the State 4-H Office at the same time as the Senior 4-H Records.
- 3. Resumes will be judged at the State level. Each county will be sent a list of those 4-H members who will be interviewed for the final selection process.
- 4. There is no set format for the resume. We encourage 4-H members to be creative in developing their own format.
- 5. There is no limit on the number of resumes from each county.
- 6. A senior 4-H member may submit both a 4-H Record and a 4-H Resume in the same project area or in a different project area.
- 7. If a 4-H'er is selected for the interview process, he or she must participate in order to be eligible for a trip.

B. Guidelines for Submitting 4-H Resumes

- 1. It is encouraged that resumes be typed or developed using a word processor.
- 2. The resume should include 4-H experiences for the current two years enrolled in 4-H. [Exceptions: 4-H members who have only been enrolled one year may report on current year experiences.]
- 3. A 4-H member can submit a record book in one project and a resume in another project area in the same year.
- 4. After a 4-H member attends a regional or national congress event based on their resume or record book, that 4-H member can apply for national scholarships, provided they meet the scholarship criteria.
- 5. 4-H members are encouraged to use their own creativity when putting their resume together. [Note: Responses limited to four pages. For an example of how resumes are outlined, please refer to Exploring Communication, Publication 1928.]
- 6. If a 4-H'er has attended an out-of-state 4-H Congress, he or she will not be eligible for that trip again. [Note: If a 4-H'er has received a trip based on his or her record book or resume, that 4-H'er will not be eligible to receive the trip again, regardless of location.
- 7. Please include information as requested in the resume form.
- 8. Resumes can be submitted in the project areas just as the record book. [Please refer to Project List for name of project areas.]
