

# FLORIDA 491 QUALIFIED SUPERVISOR WORKSHOP

This workshop aims to describe the major models of supervision for clinical social work, marriage and family therapy, or mental health counseling. It will outline the skills to develop a personal model of supervision, drawn from existing models of supervision and from preferred styles of therapy. Additionally, the co-evolving dynamics of therapist-client and supervisor-therapist-client relationships will be discussed, and distinctive issues that arise in supervision will be explored.

## PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Participants will be able to:

- Address the contextual variables in practice such as culture, gender, ethnicity, power, and economics
- Explain the ethical, legal, and regulatory issues of supervision
- Describe the role of evaluation in supervision
- Discuss the major models of supervision for clinical social work, marriage and family therapy or mental health counseling
- Develop a personal model of supervision, drawn from existing models of supervision and from preferred styles of therapy
- Explain the co-evolving dynamics of therapist-client and supervisor-therapist-client relationships
- Explore distinctive issues that arise in supervision

## ABOUT THE PRESENTERS

**Barry Nierenberg, Ph.D., ABPP** is an associate professor of psychology at Nova Southeastern University's Center for Psychological Studies. He holds a diplomate in rehabilitation psychology, is a member of the executive board of the American Board of Rehabilitation Psychology, and is the current president of the Academy of Rehabilitation Psychology. He holds additional secondary academic appointments within the Departments of Family Medicine, Psychiatry and Pediatrics at the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine. For the past 30 years, Dr. Nierenberg has held numerous leadership positions as a psychologist working with other healthcare professionals in hospitals across the country, spending the past 18 years at Jackson Memorial Hospital in Miami, Florida. He currently serves on the executive board of the Florida Department of Health's Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Advisory Council, where he previously held the post of chairman. He is the one of the past presidents of the American Psychological Association's Division of Rehabilitation Psychology. He has published and presented numerous papers both nationally and internationally. His research interests are focused on the interplay of biopsychosocial factors in chronic illness, wellness and disease, as well as healthcare disparities, pediatric psychology, and child and family adaptations to acute and chronic medical conditions.

**Tara S. Jungersen, Ph.D., NCC, ACS** is an assistant professor of psychology at Nova Southeastern University's Center for Psychological Studies. She completed her doctorate in Counselor Education and Supervision in 2009 at the University of Tennessee, and her M.Ed. in Community Counseling in 1997 from the University of Virginia. As a licensed professional counselor, Dr. Jungersen has worked in every level of care in the mental health system, including a private practice in both Phoenix, Arizona, and Chattanooga, Tennessee. As a counselor educator, she specializes in clinical mental health counseling, compassion fatigue, and clinical supervision. Her research interests include clinical supervision, counselor development, and instructional methodologies in the helping professions. Dr. Jungersen is a member of the American Counseling Association, the Association for Counselor Education and Supervision, Chi Sigma Iota National Counseling Honor Society, and Phi Kappa Phi.
