Research Interns are Pepperdine University students selected and trained by the Boone Center for the Family's Relationship IQ Project to conduct research on the growing field of relationship education and young adult relationships. Opportunities: This position is an unpaid internship. Students will receive training in conducting literature reviews, research design, SPSS, and writing research articles and reports. Students will also be trained in healthy relationship skills and theory during the summer training program as part of the rIQ operational team.

Expectations: Research Interns for the Relationship IQ Project are asked to:

- □ Commit between four and eight hours per week to the Relationship IQ Project
- □ Participate in intensive training sessions (approximately 8-10 hours) to be held in May and June.
- □ Participate in monthly training sessions and supervision sessions during the fall and spring semesters.
- □ Complete mandatory research training through Pepperdine University.
- □ Follow directions closely and be adequately self-sufficient to complete tasks.
- □ Be an enthusiastic and responsible member of the Boone Center for the Family team.

NOTE

The Boone Center operates within a faith-based context. In their roles as Research Interns, students represent the Boone Center specifically and Pepperdine University generally. Because of this, it is important that our representatives are good ambassadors for the Boone Center and the University. Research Interns should strive to conduct themselves as persons of high moral character. This includes, but is not limited to, the profiles presented on social networking web sites. Material on such sites that are deemed significantly inconsistent with the mission of the Boone Center for the Family would not support involvement as a Research Intern.
