MEET 18: UB HOSTS MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS

BUFFALO BULL-ETIN: A win against Binghamton in the regular season finale clinched the Bulls' second consecutive winning season at 8-7. Buffalo will look to avenge its 0-5 conference record with a strong showing at the MAC Championships. Buffalo's **Mark Budd** (133 pounds) is one of six wrestlers who will look to repeat as MAC Champion this weekend (Central Michigan's Luke Smith, Brandon Sinnott, Wynn Michalak; Kent State's Kurt Gross, and Northern Illinois' Johnny Galloway).

CHAMPIONSHIP INFO: With 19 NCAA bids available, the Mid-American Conference Championship is one of the most competitive in the country, as the 10 champions each earn automatic bids along with nine wild cards. As of 2/14, 15 grapplers represent the conference in the individual national rankings. Central Michigan, ranked fifth in the nation according to *InterMat's* Division I rankings, will play the odds-on favorite to win its sixth straight championship, but a strong field will provide a fight to the finish, as all six teams hold above .500 records. In the 55-year history of the tournament, Ohio has been most dominant, bringing home 15 conference championships, followed by Central Michigan and Kent State with 10 a piece.

SHERRELL, BUDD WIN MAC TITLES AS BUFFALO POSTS THIRD-PLACE FINISH

DEKALB , IL – Two weeks ago, it would have been hard to predict. Senior **Harold Sherrell** dropped a 3-1 sudden-victory decision to Slippery Rock's Matt Burkholder. Maybe the 220-pound heavyweight's Cinderella Story that led him to a 30-win season ended.

If Saturday afternoon at the Convocation Center at Northern Illinois University proved anything, it proved his Cinderella story may be just beginning. He pinned Kent State's Jermail Porter in the Mid-American Conference Championship finals for his 35th win of the season at the 4:23 mark of the match, giving the long shot his first MAC title.

The Bulls, led by a record-tying seven placewinners and champions Sherrell and junior **Mark Budd** (133 pounds), pulled a little but of a Cinderella story of their own, finishing third with 60 points, ahead of 24th-ranked Northern Illinois. It is the highest finish for the Bulls since joining the MAC in 1998-99.

"This is an unbelievable conference," head coach Jim Beichner said. "It's so tough. Every single match through the entire weekend was just hard-fought right to the end."

Budd also claimed his first Mid-American Conference title with an injury default against Eastern Michigan's Phillip Plowman. Budd took a 2-0 lead in the first period on a takedown and soon after, Plowman was hurt on a mat return, defaulting the match.

Senior **Kyle Cerminara** (197 pounds) came up on the short end once again in his rematch with top-ranked Wynn Michalak, 7-5. Cerminara came out firing, getting a takedown 15 seconds into the match. After a restart, Michalak was able to roll through Cerminara and get a reversal and a three-point near fall, but Cerminara responded with a reversal of his own, making the score, 5-4. Michalak got two escapes and Cerminara got one to close the scoring. With eight seconds left, it looked as if Cerminara might get a takedown, taking Michalak to the mat, but, just like the Feb. 5 showdown where Cerminara lost 3-2, once again, no points were rewarded after the flurry. The second-ranked wrestler in the nation, Cerminara did receive an NCAA wild card bid.

Sherrell did not let the previous match affect his, as the heavyweight was able to trade shots with Porter, a 6-6, 280-pound grappler, in the first period, rolling through a possible takedown.

"It almost feels better that I had to beat the Kent State kid," Sherrell said. "It would have been great to beat Bubba Gritter (the top-seed and Sherrell's only MAC loss of the year), but my whole season, I've been going against guys way bigger than me. That's, no doubt, the biggest and tallest guy I wrestled all season."

In the second period, Sherrell chose to be on top and after a stalemate, got the spread eagle grip on the Golden Flash and was able to seal the pin in 4:32.

"He's absolutely the Cinderella story that everybody hopes to have," Beichner said. "He came in and never qualified for a qualifier to get to the New York State Championships. Nobody would ever say Harold Sherrell is going to be a Division I wrestler. He's come along in such a great way. It's such a huge success story because he's one of the nicest guys you'll ever meet."

At 184 pounds, senior **Garrett Hicks** closed out his career in style, beating Ohio's Brian Cesear, 8-0, for third-place. Hicks finishes the season, 24-12.

Three other UB wrestlers, senior **Cliff Smith** (141 pounds), sophomore **Dana Gingerich** (149 pounds) and sophomore **Mickey Moran** (165 pounds) placed fourth after dropping third-place matches on Saturday.

Buffalo finishes behind fourth-ranked Central Michigan, which with 102.5 points wrapped up its fifth straight championship with four first-place finishes. Kent State, ranked 25th in the final NWCA poll, took second with 75.5 points. Behind Buffalo, 24th-ranked Northern Illinois had 56.5 points, Ohio had 25.5 and Eastern Michigan had 13.5.

Man of the Century

Mark Budd continues to carve his name into UB lore, as he came away with his monumental 100th career victory at Binghamton in the last meet of the season. Budd came away with a technical fall over Rob Slavin to become the fourth wrestler in school history with 100 wins. He also became the fifth member of the exclusive 100 career takedown club earlier this season at Eastern Michigan. Budd scored two takedowns at Eastern Michigan, joining the likes of UB greats Kyle Cerminara, John Stutzman, Garrett Bontempo and Josh States, who have all accumulated triple-digit totals. Budd is also inching nearer towards his 100th career victory which could come in the final two dual meets of the season. He currently stands at 98 wins.

Scott Sidelined For Remainder of Season

Redshirt freshman **Ricky Scott** became the second Bull starter to suffer a severe injury in a two-week span. Following heavyweight Jeff Parker's PCL injury sustained at the New York State Wrestling Championships, Scott suffered a torn tricep muscle prior to the team's trip to Eastern Michigan. The injury will keep him out for the remainder of the season. Scott was one of three Bulls who won 20 matches thus far this season at 197 pounds.

Stellar Escapes

Competing at 141 lbs. for most of the season, redshirt freshman **Andrew Stella** has a chance to break a 17-year old record in his first season in a UB singlet. Having scored 33 escapes with two meets remaining in the 2006-07 season, Stella trails only Mark Crays in the single-season escapes category. Crays managed 40 escapes in the 1990-91 season, and holds the all-times escapes mark with 79.

World Wide Web

Entering the starting role for the first time in his young collegiate career, freshman **Jason Weber** created a stir in Buffalo's dual meet loss to Ohio on Jan. 27. Stepping in for the injured **Jeff Parker** at heavyweight, Weber drew a tough battle in the WrestlingReport.com's 30th nationally-ranked Marcus Adelman, who entered the match having won eight straight matches. Adelman fell behind, 3-0, after Weber posted an escape and a takedown. A late takedown in the final period would clinch the Orchard Park native's first collegiate dual meet victory.

Oh, thank Heaven . . .

Senior captain **Mark Budd** captured his 11th straight dual meet victory against Ohio's Terry Jackson, who came in to the match ranked second in the conference at 133 pounds. With the win, Budd looks to continue another impressive season streak following the setback at the New York State Intercollegiate Wrestling Championships. On two separate occasions, Budd has posted at least a 10-match win streak. With the win, he further separates himself from the rest of the conference field and has his eyes set on a second consecutive MAC Championship.

King of the "Hill"iard

Redshirt freshman **Jason Hilliard** commanded a lot of attention at the 38th Annual New York State Intercollegiate Wrestling Championships on Jan. 19-20 as a four-seed. Hilliard was crowned New York State Champion at 149 pounds, running a perfect 4-0 record en route to his first collegiate tournament title. After having not competed in the month of December, Hilliard is 7-3 in January, with two of those losses

coming from nationally-ranked opponents. The Genoa, NY native has comprised an impressive 19 wins thus far this season entering the final stretch, which is tied for third best on the team.

Tournament Studs

At the New York State Wrestling Championships, all 10 UB grapplers who entered the prestigious state tournament placed in the top eight or higher. Led by Hilliard's championship run, **Dan Bishop** (125 lbs.), **Mark Budd** (133 lbs.) and **Nate Rock** (174 lbs.) each turned in runner-up performances. **Ricky Scott** (197 lbs.) came in fourth, while a trio of Bulls (**Andrew Stella**, **Justin Hunt**, and **Mike Ragusa**) each captured fifth-place. Rounding out the list of notable Bull performances was **Ray Lamb** (184 lbs.), who came in seventh, and **Jeff Parker** (285 lbs.) came in eighth.

Kyle Heads to Iran

Six months after winning a championship title at the 2006 Canada Cup, former UB wrestling great **Kyle Cerminara** was tabbed to represent the United States at the 2007 Takhti Cup in Bandar Abbas, Iran on January 18-19. Cerminara, UB's all-time winningest wrestler, competed at 96 kg/211.5 lbs., but fell to Iran's Amir Moradi, 0-5, 0-2, then, in the wrestlebacks, dropped its decision to Amin Mardani, 2-7, 1-4.

Let's Get Technical Here

Senior captain **Mark Budd** continues to climb up the UB record books, as he is now in position to claim his 100th career takedown, a feat only held by four other Bulls in team history. Budd, who sits at 98, has a chance to earn those coveted scores at the upcoming New York State Intercollegiate Wrestling Championships, where he will be the highest-ranking 133-pounder in attendance.

Meet The Parker, Again

Junior **Jeff Parker** was one of two Bulls to claim victories in UB's home loss to Northern Illinois. In the process, Parker earned his 17th victory of the season, which ties his personal season best, set in the 2004-05 season. So far on the season, Parker is second on the teams in takedowns with 20, and is currently third on the active roster in both overall career wins (43) and dual wins (15).

Bulls Drop Sixth Straight to NIU

The Bulls opened their 2006-07 Mid-American Conference schedule on a sour note, falling to Northern Illinois, 30-6. It is the sixth straight loss to the Huskies dating back to the 2001-02 season. The team had its hands full right from the get-go, as it faced four nationally-ranked opponents.

Carolina On My Mind

With top-notch performances against Gardner-Webb, Appalachian State, and UNC-Greensboro, Buffalo is back on track, upping its record to 7-2 overall in dual meet action. Senior captain **Mark Budd**, junior **Mike Ragusa**, and senior **Ray Lamb** each pulled in 3-0 records on the week, building momentum entering Mid-American Conference play on Sunday against Northern Illinois.

Tri-Meet Dominance

The Bulls began a stretch of three straight tri-meets before the holiday break and concluded that stretch on Jan. 9 with tremendous flair. Buffalo rocked Delaware State, 43-9, at the Bloomsburg Duals before falling the host Huskies. To kick off the new year, UB turned two victories over Clarion and Davidson at home, to up its record to 4-2. The upstart Bulls then traveled south to North Carolina to partake in a meet

with Gardner-Webb and Appalachian State. Having never lost to either team, UB posted two additional victories, upping its record to 6-2, going 5-1 in tri-meet action.

Seven Straight Against Ranked Opponents

Senior captain **Mark Budd** has showed why he has earned a top 10 ranking in three of the five major national polls. Budd is currently riding a streak of seven-straight matches in which he has faced a nationally-ranked opponent, starting with two wins at the Las Vegas Invitational in December. As a seven-seed, Budd earned a decision over nationally 16th-ranked Eric Albright of Virginia as well as a sudden-victory upset bid over nationally fourth-ranked Tyler McCormick of Missouri. After dropping three straight to finish sixth at the national tournament, Budd rebounded to captured decisions against nationally 15th-ranked Rick Deubel of Edinboro and 25th-ranked Ricky Donald of Bloomsburg. At 18-3, Budd is ranked ninth according to the NWCA.

STEL-LUHHHH

It only took one year for redshirt freshman **Andrew Stella** to climb up the Bulls' depth chart and land a coveted starting position. Stella earned the spot following the decision to have **Ryan Needle** compete at his natural class of 149 following a record of 0-2 at the Oklahoma Gold Classic. In light of the setback, Stella managed to shine and earn sixth place at the national tournament, then followed up his breakout performance with a fifth-place showing at the Mat Town Invitational. In three dual meets this year, Stella is has accumulated a 3-0 record and has solidified the starting spot at 141 pounds.

Bulls on Parade

In the newest Mid-American Conference Wrestling Rankings released on Dec. 12, a season-high five Bulls were recognized for their accomplishments thus far in the 2006-07 season. **Mark Budd** remains the top 133 lb. wrestler, while **Ryan Needle** and **Ricky Scott** have earned a top three ranking for the first time in their new weight classes of 149 and 197 pounds, respectively. Rounding out the Bulls' top five grapplers are Foxboro, MA natives **Mike Ragusa** at 165 pounds and **Jeff Parker** at 285 pounds.

Budding on National Stage

Seeded seventh at the 25th annual Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational, senior **Mark Budd** made his first quarterfinal appearance in the 133 pound bracket. Ranked ninth in the nation according to the USA Today/*InterMat*/NWCA poll, Budd found himself advancing to the quarterfinals after taking a sudden victory, 3-1, decision against Missouri's Tyler McCormick, who was ranked fourth in the nation. However, fatigue and stiff competition would end Budd's chances at a fourth-straight tournament title, as he met fifth-ranked Matt Keller of UT-Chattanooga, sixth-ranked Darrell Vasquez of Cal Poly, and ninth-ranked Drew Headlee of Pittsburgh. His performance would not go unnoted, as he claimed sixth place, becoming Buffalo's only placewinner on the weekend.

Great Scott!

Tabbed to finish third in the Mid-American Conference's Preseason Poll at 184 lbs. earlier this year, redshirt freshman **Ricky Scott** has earned much respect as one of the most polished freshmen in the conference. It was no wonder that at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational, Scott was seeded ninth. In his first trip to Las Vegas and first major tournament at

197 pounds, the Walden, NY native went 3-2 and narrowly pulled off a monstrous upset over nationally-sixth ranked Chris Weidman of Hofstra. As of 12/7, Scott is 12-4.

Success at Mat Town

In a change of course from last year's event, the Mat Town USA Tournament was an open event instead of a team-scoring one. The Bulls scored second in the tournament last year with ten placing-grapplers. This year, UB did one better, as a total of eleven Bulls placed at the annual tournament invite. **Mark Budd** and **Ryan Needle** each cemented themselves as individual title winners at 133 and 149, respectively. It was the second consecutive year the team had at least two title winners in Lock Haven, PA.

So, We Meet Again...

Juniors **Nate Rock** and **Mickey Moran** are by no means unfamiliar with each other and their wrestling capabilities. Not only are both members of the UB squad, but they both compete at 174 pounds. At two non-scoring events this season, both have met in the 174 lb championship match. In the first encounter at the UB Open, Moran defaulted to Rock, allowing him to take the crown. In the second matchup, a similar instance occurred, as both competitors defaulted to each other, to share top honors at the Mat Town USA Tournament. With Moran redshirting this season, Rock will see starting time on the mat.

Message Sent

Head coach Jim Beichner and the Bulls had wanted to send a message to the nation that last season was no fluke. In Buffalo's 40-4 dismantlement of Princeton on Nov. 18, the 2006-7 squad became the fifth team in UB wrestling history to score 40 or more points in its first head-to-head meet to kick off a season. The Bulls captured nine individual victories, and have won 10 of their last 13 home meets at Alumni Arena dating back to last season.

Meet The Parker

Junior **Jeff Parker** redshirted the 2005-06 season after falling with a hip injury. He had posted a 10-4 mark during that span and displayed great form at the Slippery Rock Open, where he went 4-0. One year removed, Parker is on pace to turn heads at the heavyweight position, sitting with a 6-4 record.

Two of his losses have come from narrowly from nationally-ranked opponents. He dropped a 3-2 decision to #20 Zach Hammond of Cornell in the semifinals of the UB Open, only to follow two matches later with a 1-0 decision loss to #17 Mike Spaid of Bloomsburg.

Recording a team-best 11 takedowns in a 24-9 major decision over Princeton's Kris Berr on Nov. 18, Parker has his sights set at winning a MAC Championship and qualifying for the NCAA Championships.

Redshirts and Newcomers...Oh My!

Of the sixteen Bulls who placed in Sunday's UB Open, ten of them were either newcomers or redshirts from last season. Junior **Ryan Needle** led the way for the newcomers, as he won four straight matches en route to his first UB Open title at 141 pounds. Redshirt sophomore **Scott Rendos (Brockway, PA/Brockway)** claimed his first UB Open title over Alex Conover of Ccm by a 16-1 technical fall.

Foxboro-Style

Following UB's first weekend of competitive action, juniors **Jeff Parker** and **Mike Ragusa** have emerged as two dominant wrestlers in

their respective weight classes and are both on the verge of posting their 30th career wins. Parker did not miss a beat after redshirting last season, finishing fourth in the annual UB Open. He sits one win shy of his 30th. Ragusa, having dropped down to 165 from 174, went 4-0 at the UB Open, winning the 165 individual title. He has 28 career wins.

Needle In The Haystack

Junior **Ryan Needle** demanded a lot of national attention while wrestling at Newfane high school. He currently holds the Section VI high school wins record at 240-12, and is the fifth winningest high school wrestler in New York State history.

Ryan competed for Ohio State for two seasons before transferring to UB in 2005. In his first year of competition after sitting out due to injuries last season, Ryan is expected to deliver big, as he is picked to finish second in the Mid-American Conference Preseason Poll.

Lord "Budd"ha

Senior captain **Mark Budd** is carrying over his success last season, as he earned his third straight UB Open individual title at 133 pounds. Displaying technical superiority against Lock Haven's Erik Smith in the quarterfinals, Budd took his 70th career win in stride. As of 11/8, Budd is ranked 12th according to NWCA and 11th according to *W.I.N. Magazine*, and was recognized by the Mid-American Conference to repeat as conference champion.

Life With Mickey

Junior **Mickey Moran** has completed a career turnaround like few others have done in UB history. After finishing his freshman year an abysmal 7-23, Moran bounced back and turned into one of more dominant competitors in the conference at 26-10. For his efforts, he was ranked as high as 17th in the nation by *W.I.N. magazine*, 19th by *Amateur Wrestling News* and *The WrestlingMall.com*, and 25th by *Wrestlingreport.com* at 165. This season, Mickey will redshirt, in efforts to build muscle and strength to compete next season at 174 pounds.

The Aris Twins

Freshmen brothers **Mike and Vince Aris** look to continue a stretch of successful wrestling seasons beginning in their juniors years. In their high school careers, the twosome have both seen action at the New York State High School Division II Championships, which included Mike's 2005 championship run in which he won with an impressive 3-0 performance to finish his junior year 42-2. Vince took home a fourth-place finish, en route to a 40-9 season. Combined, both have over 100 wins, two Section VI Class A titles, and are the top-two winningest grapplers in school history.

Overtaki-Ng Marcus Hutchins

Freshman **Anthony Ng** comes to Buffalo after having set his name atop one of UB's top wrestlers ever at home. Ng broke former UB grappler Marcus Hutchin's high school wins record, going 128-18.

Preseason Poll Tabs Bulls Fourth

After finishing third at last year's Mid-American Conference Championships but losing two NCAA qualifiers, the Bulls were picked to finish fourth according to the Mid-American Conference Preseason Coaches' poll that was announced by the league office on Oct. 10. The MAC decided that last season's MAC Champions, Central Michigan, would repeat in 2006. Central Michigan has been picked to win the MAC Championship for six consecutive years.

UB to Host Three Tournaments

With the release of the new schedule, it was announced that the University at Buffalo would be hosting three major tournaments throughout the 2006-07 season.

On Nov. 5, the Bulls kick-off the season by hosting the fourth annual UB Open. The UB Open is traditionally the last major meet of the calendar year, but the UB coaching staff instead planned it earlier to use it to test its youthful lineup and decide its starters.

On Jan., 19-20, the annual NYS Collegiate Championships will be held at UB's Alumni Arena. Held last year at Oswego State University, the Bulls scored a second-place showing with 134.5 points.

At the conclusion of the regular season, UB will then host the Mid-American Conference Championships the weekend of March 3-4.

Wrestling Announces Class of 2011

Coming off one of the most successful campaigns in the 67-year history of the University at Buffalo wrestling program, head coach **Jim Beichner** has put together another noteworthy recruiting class, featuring four state high school champions and ten state placewinners, while retaining a local flavor by recruiting three Section VI athletes. Included in the returnees is also **Ryan Needle**, Section VI's all-time wins leader, as the Ohio State transfer will compete for the Bulls for the first time after shoulder surgery kept him out for the entire 2005-06 season.

If last season showed anything, it was that the University at Buffalo wrestling program is ready to take its place amongst the best in the Mid-American Conference, one of the toughest in the country, with four of its six teams holding national rankings throughout last season. Much of the success is, no doubt, due to the hard work of head coach Jim Beichner.

In 2005-06, Beichner's University at Buffalo Bulls placed a school-record third at the MAC Championships, led by the individual title efforts of captains Mark Budd and Harold Sherrell. Captain Kyle Cermnara also earned a bid to the NCAA Championships, as the 197-pounder posted a UB-best ranking of second in the final NWCA poll and earned the second seed at the NCAA Championships. Budd also earned a national ranking during the season, egged on by his stunning upset of the nation's No. 1-ranked 133-pounder in December.

The rest of the Bulls also got on the winning track, as Mickey Moran went from seven wins as a freshman to 26 and a national ranking as a sophomore, helping the team garner its first national ranking, reaching 24th in the WrestlingReport.com poll.

During Beichner's tenure, the Bulls' wrestling program has undergone a complete turnaround. In 11 seasons, Beichner has guided Buffalo to a 100-66-2 (.601) dual meet record and has coached 26 Bulls at the NCAA Championships.

Beichner arrived at UB for the 1995-96 season, and guided the Bulls to a 10-4 dual meet record after going winless the previous season. The Bulls captured third place in the East Coast Wrestling Association (ECWA) Tournament and sent two wrestlers to the NCAA Championships where they each posted wins, the first-ever tournament wins for UB since its return to Division I. Additionally, coach Beichner was recognized for his efforts, receiving the New York State Division I and ECWA Coach of the Year awards, in addition to Amateur Wrestling News Rookie Coach of the Year honors.

In his first 10 years, Beichner has made a tremendous impact at the University at Buffalo. He has taken the program from a team with a combined six wins in the four years prior to his arrival to 50 wins in his first five seasons. With 100 dual meet wins, Beichner ranks behind only Ed Michael's 213 career wins at Buffalo.

Beichner and his staff have brought some of the best that collegiate wrestling has to offer to the Western New York area and continue to build a program that is making trips to the NCAA Championships on a regular basis.

This past fall, in recognition of the respect he has earned in collegiate wrestling from his peers, Beichner was chosen as President-elect of the National Wrestling Coaches Association. Beichner will begin a two-year term beginning in 2008 when he follows current President Ron Mirikitani.

2006-07 UNIVERSITY AT BUFFALO WRESTLING

Buffalo, NY • UB Open Meet #1 **No Team Scoring 11/5/06**

BUFFALO, NY - The University at Buffalo wrestling squad witnessed a second consecutive successful UB Open Sunday afternoon, as five Bulls took individual titles in their respective weight classes and kicking off the 2006-07 season with a bang. Sixteen in all placed at the fourth annual open that featured 14 top-notch wrestling schools.

Senior captain **Mark Budd** took his second UB Open title of his career at 133 pounds, winning a 10-3 decision over the Finger Lakes' Mike Grey. Budd faced three others prior to his championship finish, coasting through with a fall over Edinboro's Pat Wayne in the opening round, only to be awarded a technical fall over Lock Haven's Erik Smith, 18-2, in the quarterfinals. True freshman **Corey Greene** looked as though he would face Budd in the finals, but was bumped by Grey, 9-5. Greene rebounded to claim fourth in his first collegiate open.

At the 141 weight class, junior **Ryan Needle** began his highly-anticipated 2006-07 campaign with his first UB Open title. Needle, the third-seed, defeated Bloomburg's George Hickman in a 8-4 final decision, while downing a Mid-American Conference rival in Ohio's Kevin Christensen by a 12-4 count.

Following a redshirt campaign a season ago, sophomore **Scott Rendos** took home his first UB Open first-place trophy as he dominated the 157 field. Following a 17-0 technical fall in the quarterfinals, top-seeded Rendos took out second-seed Alex Conover of CCM with another technical fall, 16-1. Junior **Mike Ragusa** displayed a balance effort in taking his first open title. The junior grappler handed Ohio's Anthony Cirany a 6-4 decision loss.

Juniors **Mickey Moran** and **Nate Rock** were seeded first and second, respectively, so there was no surprise that they saw each other in the finals at 174. In the end, Rock would take the title, while Moran would settle for second.

Also placing for UB was redshirt freshman **Ricky Scott**, who took second in the 184 weight class; senior 197-pounder **Ray Lamb**, junior heavyweight **Jeff Parker**, and redshirt freshman 149-pounder **Jason Hilliard**, who each took fourth; and junior 157-pounder **Steven Muldrow** and freshman 197-pounder **Jimmy Hamel**, who each took fifth.

Brockport, NY • OU Gold Meet #2 **5th of 8 11/11/06**

BROCKPORT, NY - The University at Buffalo men's wrestling team amassed 63 team points in Saturday afternoon's Oklahoma Gold Classic in Brockport, NY, placing fifth out of eight teams. Senior captain **Mark Budd** was the lone Bull to claim an individual title, remaining undefeated at 8-0 after two meets. Six Bulls placed at the conclusion of the day's events.

Oklahoma took top team honors with 143 points, as the Sooners placed first in five different weight classes. Mid-American Conference rival Kent State earned 109.5 and second-place finish, while regular season opponents, Bloomsburg and Army, placed third and fourth, respectively.

Budd cleaned house as the top seed at 133 pounds, going 4-0 and winning his first Oklahoma Gold Classic title of his career. The Orrville, Ohio native captured his first win against Brown's Eli Harris with a 13-4 major decision, then bullied two Army opponents, William Simpson and Matt Kyler, downing Simpson 6-4 in the semifinals, and taking Kyler 6-1 in overtime.

As the second-seed, junior **Mike Ragusa** hit a minor setback in the semifinals, falling to Brown's Shawn Kitchner in overtime. Ragusa bounced back to claim fourth-place at 165 pounds. Also finishing fourth at 197 lbs. was senior **Ray Lamb**, who won three-straight matches en route to his best finish of his career at the annual classic.

Rounding out the rest of the Bulls who placed at Saturday's event was junior **Nate Rock**, who placed fifth after scoring a major decision and a pin to advance to the quarterfinals, only to fall to Kent State's Aaron Miller. Heavyweight **Jeff Parker** earned a similar placing, earning a fifth-place finish after rebounding in the consolation rounds. Freshman **Andrew Stella** placed sixth for his first tournament placing of his collegiate career at 141 pounds.

Buffalo, NY Meet #3 **Buffalo 40, Princeton 4 11/18/06**

BUFFALO, NY - The University at Buffalo wrestling squad cruised to a 40-4 victory over Princeton Saturday afternoon in the team's first dual meet of the season. The Bulls posted nine individual wins, with three of them coming from the three lowerweights, becoming the fifth squad in UB wrestling history to score 40 or more points in its first head-to-head meet of the season.

The Bulls (1-0) earned five technical falls in their third all-time meeting with the Princeton Tigers (0-1), and have now won ten of their last 13 home meets at Alumni Arena dating back to last season.

Sophomore **Sean Bauer** took full advantage of his first start as a Bull since transferring from Sacred Heart, earning the Bulls a 15-0 technical fall over Nikhil Pereira at 125 pounds.

Senior captain **Mark Budd** won his eighth straight victory of the season, as he posted an identical 15-0 technical fall over Jeff Kirchick. Budd led 10-0 after the first period, then scored a takedown and a 3-point near fall to end the match. Budd has now won 52 of his last 60 matches, and is now 13th all-time in UB history with 76 wins.

At 141 pounds, earning the Bulls their third straight technical fall was junior **Ryan Needle**, who earned 10 takedowns against Danny Scotten in the 27-12 lopsided win.

Redshirt freshman **Jason Hilliard** continued the Buffalo run of four straight matches won, as he tactically earned the 7-3 decision over Jesse Palermo. Hilliard managed a reversal in the later seconds to pull out his first dual meet win of his collegiate career.

Scoring a team-best 27 points against Alex Enriquez was junior **Mike Ragusa** in the Bulls' fourth technical fall of the day. Ragusa ran away with it in the third period after he has only led 10-7. The 165-pounder tallied six takedowns, three 2-point near falls and an escape in the third session.

Junior **Nate Rock** earned the Bulls four team points in his 4-0 decision over John Clore at 174 lbs, which was immediately followed by redshirt freshman **Ricky Scott**, who earned his first technical fall of his career against Gordon Scharf, 16-0, at 184 pounds. Scott managed to score all 16 of his points in the first period.

Senior **Ray Lamb** and junior **Jeff Parker** each benefited from a pair of major decisions at 197 and heavyweight, respectively. Lamb scored nine takedowns over a span of three periods, which were the first nine of his career, and recorded a riding-time point over Zach Morse, 19-7. Parker displayed dominance at heavyweight over Kristopher Berr, scoring a team-best 11 takedowns and was awarded a riding-time point at the very end to finish with a 24-9 final score.

Mat Town Invitational Meet #4 **No Team Scoring 11/25/06**

LOCK HAVEN, PA - The University at Buffalo wrestling squad posted strong numbers at the 2006 Mat Town USA Tournament on Saturday as UB had five finalists and eleven place winners. Senior captain **Mark Budd** won his second Mat Town USA title at 133 pounds, while junior **Ryan Needle** won his first title after moving up from 141 to 149.

In a change of course from last year's event, the Mat Town USA Tournament was an open event instead of a team-scoring one, allowing a total of nine schools to participate.

Las Vegas Invitational Meet #5 **30th of 47 12/1-2/06**

LAS VEGAS, NV - The University at Buffalo wrestling squad completed the final day at the 25th annual Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational Saturday evening, placing 28th in a field of 49. The Bulls performed well against many nationally-ranked competitors, as senior captain **Mark Budd** tackled five nationally-ranked opponents, en route to a sixth-place finish.

Budd, ranked 10th according to the USA Today/InterMat/NWCA, began his quest for a championship by posting a 15-5 major decision against Ben Lockett of San Francisco State and upending Cal State-Fullerton's T.J. Dillashaw in overtime, 5-4. In order to advance to the round of 16, Budd would be slated against nationally-16th ranked Eric Albright of Virginia. After a 3-2 decision, Budd would meet his toughest opponent to date, in Missouri's Tyler McCormick, ranked fourth in the nation at 133 pounds. In heroic fashion, Budd posted a 3-1 sudden victory against the All-American, earning himself a spot in the semifinals for the first time in his career.

However, Budd's opponent, Tennessee-Chattanooga's Matt Keller would advance in a 6-4 decision. Ranked fifth in the nation, Keller sent Budd into the consolation rounds, where he met even stiffer competition in nationally-sixth ranked Darrell Vasquez of Cal Poly and ninth-ranked Drew Headlee of Pittsburgh. Budd would fall in each of those matches, finishing with a weekend record of 4-3. His 15 straight wins to kick off a season was the most in his career.

Redshirt freshman **Ricky Scott** would join equal competition in the 197-pound bracket. With a 3-1 tiebreaker over Virginia's Kyle Narkiewicz, Scott insured himself a match with No. 18-ranked T.J. Morrison of Rider. Facing his first nationally-ranked opponent of his collegiate career, Scott fell by a 7-6 count.

The Walden, NY native would bounce back in the consolation round, handing decisions to Indiana's Nathan Everhart and Ohio's Larry Reichard. Scott would face his toughest opponent ever in Hofstra's Chris Weidman, who finished sixth at the NCAA Championships in 2006. Ranked sixth in the nation, Weidman posted 10 straight points on Scott, taking the major decision, 13-5. The defeat prevented Scott a chance to place at his first Las Vegas Invitational.

The Bulls sent nine grapplers in all to the annual invitational. Juniors **Ryan Needle**, **Mike Ragusa**, and **Jeff Parker** each posted wins, but fell shorts in the consolation rounds. Needle fell to nationally-fifth ranked Jordan Leen of Cornell in the preliminary round, 7-1, while Ragusa dropped a 4-1 decision to No. 13-ranked Max Dean of Indiana and Parker was upended by Oregon State's Ty Watterson, ranked sixth in the nation, halting their advances to the round of 16.

NYS Championships Meet #12 3rd of 16 01/19-20/07

BUFFALO, NY – The University at Buffalo wrestling squad battled its way to a third-place finish at the 38th Annual New York State Intercollegiate Wrestling Championships on Friday and Saturday, which was hosted at UB's Alumni Arena. The Bulls were one of three teams to score 100 team points, as redshirt freshman **Jason Hilliard** was the lone UB grappler to claim an individual title at 149 pounds. Redshirt freshman **Dan Bishop**, senior **Mark Budd**, and junior **Nate Rock** each settled for second in their respective weight classes.

Following a semifinal 12-2 upset over Division III's nationally seventh-ranked Eugene Kobilansky of NYU, Hilliard was matched up with Matt Dunn of Columbia, seeded second in the tournament. Hilliard scored a takedown in the third period to break the 4-4 tie, and ultimately claim his first-ever collegiate tournament title. With the win, Hilliard continues a streak in which at least one Bull has won a New York State individual title in the last five years.

Possibly one of the largest upsets of the day occurred at the 133-pound finals, in which Mark Budd was prevented of his third-straight New York State title by Army's William Simpson, who scored a 4-3 decision to take the title. Simpson scored a two-point takedown in the final frame to seal the win for the Black Knights, sending Budd to only his fourth defeat of the season. William became the third Simpson brother to win a New York State title.

At 125 pounds, Dan Bishop had to settle for second place, as he dropped his championship decision to Army's Fernando Martinez, 10-5. Prior to his first-ever collegiate tournament appearance, Bishop landed a pinfall over Division III's nationally fifth-ranked Mike McNally of R.I.T. at the 2:00 mark. Nate Rock proceeded to upset Division III's nationally sixth-ranked Treavor LeBlanc of Cortland in the 174 pound semifinals, 3-0, to match up with yet another ranked opponent, Columbia's Matt Palmer. The nationally 17th-ranked Palmer ran into a tough battle in the championship match, but prevailed with a 3-0 decision. Rock became the third Bull to place second at the championships.

Redshirt freshman **Ricky Scott** drew a semifinal match with Columbia's top-seeded Nick Sommerfield, and narrowly landed another UB upset at 197 lbs. However, Sommerfield held on to the slim 3-2 lead to escape with the win and an appearance in the championship bout. In the third-place match, Scott ran into another tough battle with Alfred State's Jamie Luckett. The third-seed, Luckett managed three takedowns to score the win, sending Scott into a fourth-place finish.

Top-seeded **Mike Ragusa** had redemption on his mind after dropping two consecutive matches to Cornell's Mike Mackie and Brockport's Shaheim Bradshaw, currently Division III's nationally seventh-ranked wrestler at 165 pounds. Ragusa upended Nassau's second-seeded Chris Wade, 9-5, to take fifth place. Other fifth-place finishers for Buffalo were redshirt freshmen **Andrew Stella** and **Justin Hunt**.

Athens, OH Meet #13 Ohio 25, Buffalo 9 01/27/07

BUFFALO, NY –The University at Buffalo wrestling squad were prevented of its first Mid-American Conference victory Saturday afternoon, as it was downed by Ohio, 25-9. A reversal of last year's 25-9 UB victory, the Bulls could only muster three dual-meet decisions in the team's second conference defeat of the season.

With the meet starting at 125 pounds, the Bobcats (13-6, 2-1) took an early 3-0 lead. The MAC's top-ranked wrestler at 133 pounds, senior captain **Mark Budd**, disposed of Terry Jackson, ranked second in the MAC behind Budd, 2-1. Budd held a riding time advantage at the end of the match that boosted him to his 28th win of the season. He remains a perfect 11-0 in dual meet action.

The Bobcats would go on to score 19 unanswered points before the Bulls (7-4, 0-2) would earn its second decision of the match at 184 pounds. Senior **Ray Lamb** capitalized on three takedowns to claim the 7-4 victory. At 197 pounds, redshirt freshman **Ricky Scott** fell behind at the start of the second period following a reversal from Larry Reichard. The two points earned on the turn would be too much, as Scott would only be awarded an escape in the final period, dropping the 3-1 decision.

The meet's final match would feature the debut of freshman **Jason Weber**, who ended Marcus Adelman's nine-win streak with a 5-4 decision. Coming in to the match ranked 30th in Wrestlingreport.com's top 30 national ranking poll, Adelman fell behind, 3-0, after Weber posted an escape and a takedown. A late takedown in the final period would clinch the Orchard Park native's first collegiate dual meet victory.

YPSILANTI, MI –The University at Buffalo wrestling team headed out Saturday morning to the State of Michigan for the first of two consecutive Mid-American Conference matches in a two-day span. Despite a strong 7-0 lead after two matches, the Bulls were unable to turn the contest in their favor, falling to Eastern Michigan, 28-10. The defeat prevents the Bulls from capturing their first conference win of the season, as they are now riding a three-match losing skid.

With a 7-0 lead, the Bulls (7-5, 0-3 MAC) handed the Eagles (4-5, 1-3 MAC) five straight decisions that resulted in 18 unanswered points. The deficit was too much, as Eastern Michigan scored its first conference win of the season.

Redshirt freshman **Dan Bishop** kicked off the dual meet with a dominating 12-0 major decision over fellow redshirt freshman Jack Cassedy. It is the largest margin of victory handed out this season by Bishop at 125 pounds, as he captured his first career conference win. Senior captain **Mark Budd** continues to pave his way towards a MAC Championship by earning a 5-2 decision over Chris Jenkins. With the win, Budd increases his career wins total to 97 and remains 3 wins shy of joining the 100-win club which features only four others in school history.

Three straight major decisions doomed Buffalo, as the tables soon turned in EMU's favor. EMU's Jermain Thompson, currently ranked 18th in the nation according to the InterMat/NWCA/NWMA Individual Rankings poll at 149 pounds, bounced back from a loss the previous meet against Central Michigan's Brandon Carter to hand redshirt freshman **Jason Hilliard** his second conference loss of the season, 14-3.

Senior **Ray Lamb** ended the EMU run by claiming his 20th victory of the season in a 11-3 win over John McClure, ranked fourth in the conference at 184 pounds. Lamb has now won seven of his last eight dual meet matches.

Buffalo, NY Meet #16 #25 Kent State 31, Buffalo 7 02/09/07

BUFFALO, NY – The University at Buffalo wrestling squad completed its Mid-American Conference schedule Friday night on a sour note, dropping its final home dual meet match to nationally 25th-ranked Kent State, 31-7. The Bulls end the conference season at 0-5 despite strong efforts from senior **Mark Budd** and junior **Mike Ragusa**, who each landed wins for UB.

The Bulls are currently riding a five-match losing streak (each of which came against conference) as they drop to 7-7 on the season. The 0-5 record marks the first time since joining the MAC in 1998 that Buffalo was unable to capture a conference win. The MAC-leading Golden Flashes (14-2, 3-0 MAC) took eight matches in part due to their seven nationally-ranked grapplers, each of whom captured wins.

Redshirt freshman **Dan Bishop** landed the first punch in the meet by scoring an early takedown against nationally 18th-ranked Chad Sportelli. Unfortunately, Sportelli's experience would allow him to score key takedowns and score over two minutes of riding time to win, 9-3.

At 133 pounds, Mark Budd continued to plow past conference foes, cementing a perfect 5-0 MAC record with a 9-0 against Danny Mitcheff. On senior day, Budd shutout Mitcheff for his 99th career victory and is in line to earn his monumental 100th win at Binghamton next weekend. The feat has been reached by only three others in UB lore. Budd remains undefeated in dual meet action (14-0).

Junior Mike Ragusa also won over the crowd at Alumni Arena Friday night by ending his five-match losing streak against Sli Bostelman, 8-4. Ragusa landed three takedowns in all, winning his first match at home since the home opener on Nov. 18 against Princeton.

141-pounder **Andrew Stella** was prevented of his first-ever conference win against Drew Lashaway, 10-4. The redshirt freshman scored four escapes in the hard-fought match and is now three shy of the UB single-season escapes record held by Mark Crays (1990-91).

The second senior on the Bulls starting roster, 184-pounder **Ray Lamb** was within seconds of forcing an overtime bout with nationally 20th-ranked Eric Chine. Both competitors entered the final stanza with Lamb ahead, 1-0. With it being Kent State's choice, Chine chose the down position and earned a escape to lock the score at 1-1. With time winding down, Chine closed in and scored a takedown with :02 left in the match to take the decision, 3-1.

Nationally 19th-ranked Jermail Porter bullied heavyweight **Jason Weber** with a 8-3 decision. Porter allowed Weber to score three escapes, but immediately hammered down on Weber with three takedowns. The Kent State heavyweight was Weber's third-straight nationally-ranked opponent faced in as many meets, earning a record of 1-2 in that span.

Junior **Nate Rock** battled tough against Josh Patterson, holding the 7-6 edge as time expired. The win ends a five-match losing streak for Rock.

Senior **Ray Lamb** scored a 16-3 major decision over Corey Waite to increase the UB lead, 11-6. After having dropped the last two matches to nationally-ranked opponents, Lamb finished the year as one of four Buffalo grapplers with 20 wins on the season. Heavyweight junior **Jeff Parker** returned to the mats after having been out of action for four weeks to claim his 20th win of the season over Mike Patterson, 7-4. Redshirt freshman **Andrew Stella** recorded the match-clinching win at 141 pounds with a 8-4 decision over Brandon Toro-Segarra.

The Bulls finish the regular season at 8-7, and will await the Mid-American Conference Championships beginning on Saturday, March 3. The annual championships will be hosted at the University at Buffalo's Alumni Arena.

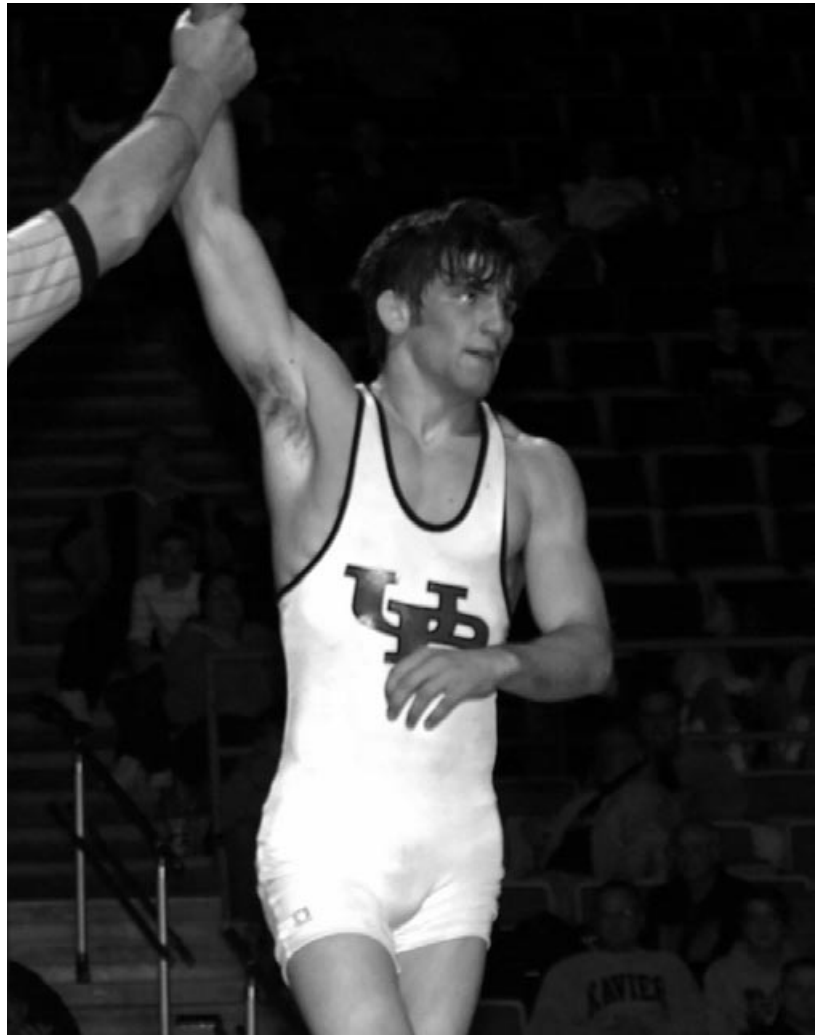
