### Evaluation Design

A series of focus groups will be developed during the educational activity with the youth participants. The purpose of the focus group will be to establish the attitudes, needs and concerns of youth in respect to integrated nonpoint source and environment leadership youth project. Results will also be used to design a pre-test and post-test instrument to show the change in knowledge, aspirations, skills and attitudes on the topic due to the training.

A focus group will also be utilized with ten (10) youth leaders to assess their inputs for the environmental leadership state

conference.

As a part of the conference registration process, participants will provide a narrative, documenting their experiences since they first joined the project. The purpose of the narrative will be to provide an opportunity to participants for expressing their expectations for the conference, to determine the positive side of their experiences, their barriers, and ways to improve the project. The inputs of participants will also be utilized to design the educational conference based on the need of the target clientele.

Content analysis of the narratives will also be used to design a pre-test and post-test instrument to show the change in knowledge, aspirations, skills and attitudes on the topic due

to the training.

A combination of quantitative and qualitative instruments will be developed on training observations, informal interviews, narratives, attendance list and individual training evaluations will be collected and utilized to improve

and refine future training sessions.
Results of the pre-test and post-test scores will be utilized to estimate the success of the project in fostering change in attitude, skills, aspirations and knowledge on integrated nonpoint source and environment leadership youth project
