## 1 Introduction

In this course we have discussed a wide variety of issues that relate traditional frameworks of ethics to modern technological issues. ## 2 Requirements

Your paper should consist of the following parts:

- An introduction including any necessary background information
- A description of the various issues and sides
- An application of at least one ethical framework to analyze the problem
- Your opinion and conclusion on the issue

Your intended audience is your peers in Computer Science, however not necessarily having taken this class.

## 3 Presentation

For the final class, on Thursday, August 3, 2006, every student will present his or her topic summarily condensed into a 8 to 10 minute presentation. Visual aids are welcome but not required. In this time you will present the background and various sides of your issue, and a short statement on your position backed up by an argument based in an ethical framework.

## 4 Topic Selection

By Tuesday, July 18, 2006, you should send me an email with your proposed topic for approval.

## 5 Suggestions and Style

Please remember that anything that is not common knowledge or your opinion must be cited appropriately. Please make sure that if your source is a web page, that it is trustworthy. The outcome of the first assignment is that no Wikipedia or Encyclopedia reference will be accepted.

## 6 Requirements

This assignment should be no less than 10 pages and no more than 12 pages in length. You should exclude the bibliography from the page count.
