#### Dear Student,

Thank you for your interest in the team and in applying for a scholarship. Should you join the team, you will become part of a legacy of students who have not only been successful in forensics competition, but who have gone on to use their speaking skills in their careers and ministries for the glory of God.

The Biola Forensics team competes in Individual Events (IE - speech), NFA-style Lincoln Douglas Debate (LD), and Parliamentary Debate (Parli). All students on scholarship compete in at least one individual event. From that point, students specialize in either an IE track (3 additional IE's) or a Debate track (competition in LD & Parli).

Competing on the team represents a substantial commitment. Scholarshipped competitors should plan on considerable work over the summer to prepare their events. The team has a two-day "training camp" on campus during the beginning of the fall semester, and students practice a minimum of 4.5 hours during the week in preparation for tournaments.

Scholarships generally start at \$4,000 per year. Though this amount certainly is not enough to pay for a full ride at Biola, it does help. Students with substantial experience are eligible for greater scholarship amounts, depending on competitive success, service to the team, and/or years of competition experience. Returning students are encouraged to apply for additional amounts based on their qualifications. Typically, new students to the team are ineligible for greater amounts; however, I will consider all requests for additional funds for those who want to go beyond the basic commitment. *Please note that any scholarship funds received from Forensics could affect any need-based aid that you have been awarded by the university.* 

A student does not need to be scholarshipped to be on the team. Students may "walk on" to the team as well. I cannot give scholarships to all who apply, but I welcome those who want to join the team because of the great opportunities it presents. Bottom line, I want people on the team who love speaking, performing, and debating—whether they receive a scholarship or not. A "walk-on" does not need any prior experience—they just need the desire to become a better communicator.

If you have a video of one of your performances or debates, it would be very helpful if you could send a copy or even email it to me. Though not required, it helps us to know what aptitudes you bring to the table. Be sure, however, to have at least two people who can recommend you send a note either via US Mail or email (preferred).
