- > Open to give advice to young women
- > A positive role model
- > Feels confident in describing your career
- > Can offer career advice

Responsibilities of a Mentor as the Symposium

- Explore the students' interests and career desires
- > Tell students about yourself
- > Establish a rapport with the students
- ➤ Describe your career and how you prepared for your career
- > Explain various career opportunities that exist
- ➤ Help the students think outside of the box; think beyond traditional careers
- ➤ Give them advice about how they can prepare for their futures, including possible courses to take, volunteer opportunities, etc.
- ➤ Describe different educational experiences they can explore for life after high school: technical schools, junior college, college, lifelong learning
- > Tell them about places to get more information, what they should read

Responsibilities of a Mentor outside the Symposium

- > Provide feedback about your mentoring experience to Junior Achievement
- ➤ Encourage the young women to contact you if they need guidance in the future
