Four Corners-TTAP Road Scholar

The Clean Water Act of 1987 required the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to implement a program to regulate the quality of discharges and runoff from industrial and construction sites. This program, known as the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES), went into effect in October 1992.

The workshop will focus on storm water pollution prevention and erosion and sediment control. Participants will learn about applying the requirements of the Federal National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit (NPDES); preparing a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP); conducting an erosion and sediment control project site analysis; implementing a SWPPP; selecting temporary and permanent Best Management Practices (BMPs) including green infrastructure; inspection of BMPs and storm water management good housekeeping practices for tribal operations.

Participants are encouraged to bring specific erosion and sediment control problems to the workshop for discussion.

The purpose of the workshop is for participants to learn how to plan, design and implement a storm water erosion and sediment control plan.
