In Colorado, anyone engaged in the business of applying or supervising the use of pesticides in exchange for payment is required to be licensed as a Commercial Pesticide Applicator by the Colorado Department of Agriculture (CDA). Private pesticide applicators must be licensed by the CDA before they may purchase or apply restricted use pesticides on their own lands.

Colorado State University Tri River Area Extension's Pest Management Workshop is conducted annually to provide all licensed pesticide applicators the opportunity to receive the required continuing education credits required to maintain their certification at a single workshop.

This program is for pesticide applicators who are already licensed. If you do not have a current pesticide applicators license, you must take a test and be licensed with the CDA before continuing education credits can be issued.

The Tuesday morning program meets all continuing education credit requirements for private pesticide applicators licensed with the CDA. This session fulfills core categories for commercial pesticide applicators. Commercial applicators are required to attend additional one-hour sessions in each category for which they are licensed.

CEC's are also available for commercial pesticide applicators licensed in Utah, New Mexico and Wyoming. Education credits vary with these states.
