Welcome to the 2012 National Camping School at Camp Bud Schiele near Ashville, NC.

Your application has been received and on behalf of the camping school faculty, we eagerly look forward to having you with us at **Camp Bud Schiele**. The Council Liaison for this camp school will be **Kirk Setzer**. He can be contacted at **kirk.setzer@scouting.org**.

An Annual medical examination and health record, completed within the past 12 months, is required and must be completed <u>prior</u> to your arrival. <u>Please bring the completed form with you</u>. If you do not have this required form, you will need to obtain one at your own expense prior to beginning class. Cost will likely be a **MIMIMUN** of \$100.

Please plan to arrive between 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. (local time) on Saturday, May 19th. Departure will be after breakfast on Friday, May 25, 2012. All participants who are enrolled in any retraining sections will be able to depart after Noon on May 22.

<u>Complete, correct BSA uniforms are required</u>. The BSA Field Uniform (Scout shorts or long trousers, Scout shirts, Venturing shirts, Scout socks) or the BSA Activity Uniform (Scout shorts or pants with Scouting golf or t-shirts) will be worn at camping school. Complete field uniform is required for evening meals, worship services, campfires, and other formal activities. (See attached Uniform Inspection Sheet.) Housing will be tents with beds and foam mats. <u>Bedding and linens will not be provided</u>. The telephone number at Camp Bud Schiele is **828-287-2299** in case of emergency.

In addition to the items listed above, please bring an open mind, a cooperative attitude, a willing smile, a lot of enthusiasm, and we'll have a great course.

If you are arriving early due to travel arrangements, you may come on Friday. The early arrival fee is \$40, which includes dinner on Friday and breakfast on Saturday. Your council will be billed if you arrive early so be sure to consult with them prior to arriving early.

If you are participating in the **Pistol portion of Shooting Sports**, your class will begin at **8:00 AM on Friday, May 18, 2012**. You can plan to arrive on Thursday evening. Thursday night lodging and breakfast, lunch and dinner on Friday are included in your fee.

The host council <u>has made</u> arrangements for ground transportation from the Charlotte Douglas International airport. If you plan to travel by air you need to contact **Kirk Setzer** at kirk.setzer@scouting.org to make arrangements for a pickup time and payment for the shuttle. This fee is \$25 round trip.

Directions to Boy Scout Camp:

From Charlotte, NC

- Take I-85 South to HWY 74 West Ext. 10B
- Take Hwy 74 West go approximately 20 miles pass Shelby towards Forest City
- Take Exit 181 Forest City/Spindale Exit
- Exit will veer right stay straight at 4-lane road
- Road will turn into tow lane (Rock Rd.) at the intersection with Bi-Lo, McDonalds, KFC and Eckerd
- Go through the town of Ruth and continue to go straight
- You will cross over Hwy 64 and Pass Tanner outlet on right. Go to the end of Rock Rd.
- Make a left onto Hudlow Rd
- Proceed on Hudlow Rd. approximately ½ mile to Boy Scout Road take a right at the first entrance on the right.

From Hickory:

- Take I-40 West to Hwy. 64 Exit 103 Morganton
- Take left on Hwy 64 West and proceed 22 miles
- Landmark: Pisgah Church on left. Go 1.3 miles and take a right onto Centennial Rd.
- Proceed 2.3 miles and take left on Boy Scout Rd. and take a left at the second entrance on the left. (Cub Scout Camp entrance will be on the left first)

From Ashville, NC:

- Take I-40 East to Hwy 64 Exit 103 Morganton
- Take left on Hwy 64 West and proceed 22 miles
- Landmark: Pisgah Church on left. Go 1.3 miles and take a right onto Centennial Rd.
- Proceed 2.3 miles and take left on Boy Scout Rd. and take a left at the second entrance on the left. (Cub Scout Camp entrance will be on the left first)
