
- Arrive at least 15 minutes before the examination to avoid panic.
- All equipment must be in a transparent zip lock bag/ pencil case.
- Lock mobile phones/ valuables in locker prior to examination.
- No talking, sharing information or using notes.
- Go to the toilet before the examination.



Students may go home directly after their examinations for that day end. They should avoid wasting time at the Junction after examinations and go directly home and start preparing for the next examination.

If students can only be picked up later from school, they are able to study in the Library, which is open and supervised until 4:30pm.


















REDDAM GIVES BACK
