No matter if you are in elementary school, looking for a job, applying for social security or veterans benefits...you need to use the internet to be successful. 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Governor Scott Walker and Enthusiastic Bidders Raise \$80,988 for Wisconsin 4-H Youth



Governor Walker worked the crowd from the stage, encouraging bidders to increase their bids, and contributed to a sale that raised \$80,988 for nearly 350,000 Wisconsin 4-H youth and youth programs at this year's Governor's Blue Ribbon Meat Products Auction. The auction's proceeds support Wisconsin 4-H activities including 4-H conferences, teaching materials and workshops, and overall development of 4-H youth. The auction was held August 6 at Wisconsin State Fair Park.

Besides the 4-H youth, the star of the evening was Haen Meat Packing, a meat processor from Kaukauna, Wis., named the 2013 Best in Show. Haen Meat Packing, who earned the honor for their Bone-in Ham, competed against over 100 entries for the coveted title. The Best in Show bone-in ham sold for \$12,000 to a consortium formed by Country Fresh Meats, Egg Innovations, Hartmann Sand and Gravel, Wisconsin State Fair Park Board and UW-Extension. Haen Meat Packing was on the auction block five other times during the evening earning Grand Champion and Reserve Champion awards for several of their products.

Auctioneers Bob Johnson and Gary Finley, emcee Bob Meyer and Governor Walker not only sold each Grand Champion and Reserve Champion entries from the Wisconsin State Fair Meat Products Contest but also several Wisconsin-themed packages. Based in Madison, Wis., the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation provides essential funding for 4-H programs throughout Wisconsin. By partnering with individuals, corporations and foundations, the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation supports nearly 350,000 youth who take part in various 4-H leadership, development and community-building activities throughout the state. 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Annual Leader Training for Volunteers – 2013-2014

4-H Organizational Leaders know that each year Wisconsin requires a specific leader training lesson to be taught to club leaders. In 2014...the Annual Leadership Training will have a different look!

The Annual 4-H Volunteer Leader Training is a requirement for each chartered 4-H club/group to attend as part of the charter and renewal process. We want as many volunteers to be engaged in training as possible. We know the more training and support we can provide to our volunteers the more successful they will be in their role as volunteers in 4-H Youth Development. The eforums are a great way to engage more volunteers. It is designed for youth and adult leaders. At least one leader from each club is required to attend at least one of the training sessions.

Instead of including the training at our district meetings, the state of Wisconsin will be using the North Central Regional Volunteer e-Forum trainings. The North Central Region Volunteer Forum is an opportunity for volunteers to connect with Extension professionals and other volunteers from across a twelve state region. There are four on-line trainings being offered through this venue: http://4h.uwex.edu/ncrvd/eForum2013.cfm).

November 18th---OMG! You've Got 4-H Parents! Now What??

Parents play a critical role in deciding the organizations in which their children will participate. The experience the family has in 4-H during their first year is important for long-term participation. This session will help volunteers explore a variety of strategies to increase positive parental support of local 4-H programs. As a result, parents will stay connected with their own children, recognize mutual expectations and responsibilities between parents and volunteers, and become caring adults for other youth.

December 3rd---Engaging Teens & Older Youth

Research has clearly shown that quality youth programs, those proven most effective and rated highly by young people themselves, are masterful at engaging youth at the highest level in planning, making choices, and reflecting on their learning. Attention to making youth programs fun, interesting, welcoming and encouraging to young people in our 4-H Youth Development programs is important but not enough. This session, co-developed and delivered by youth, will provide insight, tools and resources volunteers can use to more effectively engage and meet the needs of teen members, a common challenge in youth programs.

January 14th---Using Technology to Enhance Your 4-H Experience

Technology can be a great tool to support better communication and learning with 4-H participants. However, keeping up with the latest trends and changes can be challenging and overwhelming. This session will share some easy ways that technology can help 4-H leaders be better connected with youth participants. It will also briefly explore ideas on integrating technology into 4-H projects to enhance the life skill development and 21st century skills of young people.

February 3rd --- Exploring the Science of 4-H Projects

Does the idea of emphasizing science in 4-H make you sweat? It doesn't have to be scary. Discover methods to reinforce simple science concepts using traditional 4-H projects. You will take home ready-to-go activities that incorporate science concepts across the curriculum areas.

All sessions will be held from 7 to 8:30 pm in Conference Room #5 at the UW-Extension Office Building, 212 River Drive, Wausau. Registration is requested at least 1 week before the training date.
