<u>Study Tour Highlights – Tue, 12 March</u> Auckland

Eden Park Site Visit

Eden Park is New Zealand's largest stadium. Our rich sporting and social history, and our international profile, is unmatched by any other stadium in the country. Eden Park has been in existence as a sports ground since 1900. It began its life as a swamp, but by 1914 the ground was drained and turned into two ovals.

The \$256 million redevelopment that was completed in October 2010 provided a permanent capacity of 50,000 and the ability to add a further 10,000 temporary seats for the 2011 Rugby World Cup games. This is the largest of any New Zealand sports arena. There are no standing areas. Temporary seating in front of the North Stand and the West Stand (usually only used for international rugby matches) is required for the capacity to be reached.





Wynyard Quarter Site Visit

The launch of Wynyard Quarter, as the precinct is known, marks completion of the first stage of the 25 year redevelopment of central Auckland's western waterfront. The redevelopment encompasses residential, commercial and public amenity spaces and will include the area currently occupied by a number of industrial sites.

Wynyard Quarter's key features include Karanga Plaza, a 4855m2 public space incorporating an information kiosk made of shipping containers and tidal steps to the water's edge and a Heritage tramway, a new 1.5km circuit bringing the first trams back to downtown Auckland in over half a century.

Welcome Dinner – Orbit Restaurant

Stunning views and food to match - Orbit Revolving Restaurant is situated at the top of the Sky Tower, 190 metres above the ground. The dining room rotates once every hour, providing a truly unique experience and amazing 360-degree views of Auckland City.

Dinner also includes complimentary admission to the Sky Tower Main Observation level prior to dining.



<u>Study Tour Highlights – Wed, 13 March</u> Wellington

Wellington International Airport Redevelopment

"The Rock" was a \$39 million-project for the new international passenger terminal of Wellington International Airport, that has been designed by Studio Pacific Architecture. What is supposed to become "New Zealand's newest iconic building", is trying to create optimum functionality and environmental sustainability at the same time.

The international passenger terminal, named "the Rock" completed the terminal's expansion and upgrade. The new facility will complete the immense improvement in the passenger's intuitive journey from the departure point from the main terminal to the aircraft door. The building and its dramatic design are supposed to create a unique and memorable visitor experience, contrasting the bland halls that typify most international airports.

<u>Study Tour Highlights – Thur, 14 March</u> Christchurch

RED ZONE TOUR & Presentation

In the wake of the Canterbury earthquakes Christchurch has shifted from response to recovery and revitalization. Participants will have the unique experience of being able to tour the Red Zone with members of the Christchurch Central Development Unit.

In the evening, participants will have the opportunity to hear from Warwick Isaacs, head of the Christchurch Central Development Unit (CCDU) tasked with leading the restoration and enhancement of the central city. He will discuss the lessons, challenges, and opportunities of one of the most ambitious projects in New Zealand's history.

As the Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Authority's (CERA) General Manager Operations, Warwick has managed the demolition and operations work programme - both residential and commercial - throughout greater Christchurch.

This huge job has been challenging, and at times controversial, with Warwick having to oversee some of the tougher decisions about the future of some of Christchurch's most iconic and historic buildings.
