11.00 AM	(This memorial pays tribute to the troops who, fighting for the liberation of Europe in World War II, stormed the beaches of Normandy on June 6, 1944.)

12:15 PM	Lunch (included) at Olde Liberty Station, the former train station for Bedford, Virginia
1:30 PM	Depart Olde Liberty Station in Bedford, Virginia
2:45 PM	Arrive at Virginia Military Institute in Lexington, Virginia for a guided tour
4:00 PM	Tour of Virginia Military Institute ends and we <u>watch student military parade if the weather is</u> <u>cooperative. If the parade is canceled due to inclement weather or other reasons, we will tour the</u> <u>George C. Marshall Museum on the Virginia Military Institute campus</u> . George C. Marshall was responsible for crafting the "Marshall Plan" in World War II.

9:00 AM	Arrive at President Woodrow Wilson's Home and Presidential Museum in Staunton, Virginia (We tour Woodrow Wilson's birthplace, the Presbyterian Manse, a Greek revival house adjacent to his Presidential Museum. This restored home depicts the Wilsons' family life in the Shenandoah Valley prior to the Civil War. A quaint Victorian garden is also on the grounds. Then we proceed to the Woodrow Wilson Presidential Museum for a self guided tour. Exhibit galleries and archives in this restored 1855 mansion not only present the legacy of the 28 th president of the United States, but also Wilson's other roles as a scholar, president of Princeton University, and New Jersey governor.)

12:00 PM	Arrive in Charlottesville, Virginia and have lunch (included) at Michie's Tavern (This historic tavern was established by Scotsman William Michie in 1784, serving food and drink)

1:30 PM	Arrive at Thomas Jefferson's Monticello in Charlottesville, Virginia for a guided tour (Monticello served as Thomas Jefferson's home from 1770 until his death in 1826. This home showcases his numerous innovations and diversity of interests. He is buried on the grounds.)
3:45 PM	Depart Thomas Jefferson's Monticello
4:00 PM	Arrive at James Monroe's Ash Lawn in Charlottesville, Virginia for a guided tour (This 535 acre estate was originally owned by James Monroe, fifth president of the United States. His neighbor Thomas Jefferson personally selected the site and sent his gardeners to plant orchards. President James Monroe and his wife moved here in 1799 and created a working tobacco plantation).

The 2,700 acres estate includes more than 130 buildings, extensive gardens and forests and a steeplechase course. Madison and his wife, Dolley – America's "first" First Lady – are buried in the family cemetery. We will view an orientation film on Montpelier before touring this home.)
