

A Morning with Dr. Wayne Hammond

Presentation Details: This presentation will provide an overview of the Resiliency Model and framework that is used to assess resiliency, build capacity, and shift paradigms toward strength-based culture. Dr. Hammond will discuss how building a strength-based perspective and practice produces positive changes in how our students think and feel about themselves, and increases our own understanding of our students and how we work with them.

Participants will come away from this workshop with an understanding of the Resiliency Framework and practical strategies of how to use strength-based practices in their own classrooms.

Speaker Bio: Dr. Wayne Hammond is the president and executive director of Resiliency Initiatives (www.resil.ca). He holds adjunct status at the School of Medicine at the University of Calgary. Over the past twenty years, Dr. Hammond has worked with high-risk youth and their families with a focus on abuse, violence and mental health concerns. Dr. Hammond is an active lecturer on mental health concerns and the implications of strength-based practice in the home and in schools.
