Last week, we headed to Darling Harbour to watch a couple of films about Antarctica. We are researching and learning about Antarctica in our English and HSIE units this term. Both films were incredible. One was just named 'Antarctica' and was all about the landscape, climate, conditions and extremes of the coldest desert in the world. The second film was 'Shackleton' and was all about the incredible race to be the first to reach the South Pole over 100 years ago. It focussed on the incredible conditions and challenges that faced the polar explorers who reached the pole with basic equipment, courage and endless optimism. It was great to see how incredible
 Antarctica really is.

After the films, we had lunch at Tumbalong Park and got to play in a huge playground. There was a flying fox, water features and an enormous rope climbing frame. All in all, it was a great day out!


Recently we've been lucky to have been treated to two science shows at school. David Morgan-Mar came again and talked to us about the universe and the possibility of life forms other than human beings living somewhere in a galaxy far, far away. His talks are always fascinating.


We also had a visit from Mitchell Serena, Director of Kaleidoscope
 Science, who showed us a whole lot of crazy experiments with fire and liquid nitrogen! We learnt a lot about temperature and how different materials behave in various states. We even had a few explosions which the scientist assured us were on purpose!

## Mathenatics

Last week, Stage 3 students learnt about Cartesian planes and how to plot coordinates in a larger than life way! Students had the opportunity to 'be' coordinates on a giant Cartesian plane on the oval. They really benefited from seeing real life examples of Maths in practice!
