- <u>Student Admitted Status</u> -You must be accepted under **regular or provisional admit status** by the Graduate Admissions office. If you are not accepted or are currently admitted under <u>evaluation or non-matriculated</u> <u>status</u>, you are not eligible for federal loans until your status changes to regular or provisional admission.
- You must be **matriculated and registered for at least 6 credit hours** in each term that you want to receive loan funds for. (The summer sessions combined are considered a term.)


