GEOFFREY FIEGER TRIAL PRACTICE INSTITUTE CERTIFICATE PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

About the Geoffrey Fieger Trial Practice Institute

The Geoffrey Fieger Trial Practice Institute (TPI) at MSU College of Law is a comprehensive set of programs aimed at bridging the law school experience with the practice of trial law in real-world settings. A rigorous, **two-year certificate program** is the central component to the Geoffrey Fieger Trial Practice Institute. The curriculum was designed in collaboration with practicing trial lawyers and judges and features required and elective courses related to pretrial and trial skills.

Classes are taught by seasoned litigators who bring a real-world perspective to the classroom. Students receive intensive training in drafting oral arguments and other trial simulations in front of actual judges and seasoned litigators. Interdisciplinary learning opportunities include collaborations with other MSU programs. The theatre department will offer training in courtroom demeanor and public speaking, and students will learn about forensic science through the School of Criminal Justice. All courses are designed to assist students in understanding and empathizing with the jury, judge, and opposition. Fieger said, "Good trial lawyers must understand human experience and, above all else, know themselves."

Interested students may apply in Spring 2006, and after a highly selective process, accepted students start the program in Fall 2006. The selection process admits students based on their potential for successful trial advocacy rather than academic performance serving as the sole criterion. After two years of comprehensive training in trial practice, students will be awarded a Certificate of Trial Practice. A scholarship program awards tuition grants to the most promising students.

Students in both the full-time and part-time programs are eligible for admission in the Certificate Program, so long as they have completed at least 24 credits. Some courses, however, may be offered only in the evening, or, on rare occasions, only in the day. No deviations from the schedule will be authorized or permitted.

An annual lecture series showcasing nationally known trial lawyers as well as professional mentoring are important elements of the Institute. In addition to showing students the intricacies of trial practice, mentors offer advice and leads on job placement opportunities.

The Law College's **fully functional trial courtroom** is the backdrop for the Institute's program to train students in the latest techniques available for use in trial practice through extensive sets of simulations.

Practical, hands-on experience is an integral part of the Institute. Every student in the institute graduates with a portfolio of legal, trial-related writing to show prospective employers.
