2. The MA/NS elective can be fulfilled by a MA course numbered 200 or higher which does not duplicate material presented in any previously taken course. ST242, as well as any NASE course, also fulfills the requirement.
3. Elective guidelines are available in the Registration Booklet.
4. Students pursuing a traditional FI major can apply any FI courses (except FI 270) that are not otherwise required to fulfill the FI elective requirements. Students may use either FI 421- Internship in Finance or FI 401- Directed Study in Finance as one of their Finance electives, but not both. Students wishing to pursue a concentration in Financial Planning, Corporate Finance, or Capital Markets should consult the list of concentration courses on the second page of this form.
5. An optional 12-credit minor program must be pre-approved by the appropriate academic department.
