## Admission Procedure for EBUS:

the start of each semester and before registration, the CBE Student Academic and Career Services office will notify PEBU students of their admission status by e-mail to their Towson e-mail addresses. Students who have met the requirements in effect for their catalog year will be automatically admitted to the major and will be eligible to take upper-level "majors-only" CBE courses

Students who take upper-level "majors-only" CBE courses before being admitted to the e-Business Administration major do so at their own risk.
