Ages 8-10: Diary of a Poetic Kid: "Ode" School

In this camp for young writers, ages 8-10, students will write "ode" style poetry where they look for ordinary and overlooked objects in their everyday lives, to pay tribute to. When writing "ode school", the poet's purpose is to write to an ordinary person, place or thing with exaggerated adoration or deliberate disgust. Students will learn to incorporate poetic devices such as simile, metaphor, personification, repetition and hyperbole--just to name a few--when crafting original odes in their poetry diaries. Writers in this camp will publish an extraordinary anthology of their love for ordinary things.

Ages 11-14: Spinning Shakespearean Sonnets Ages

Sometimes Shakespeare's Sonnets can have your head spinning...now it's time to put your own personal twist on this form of poetry!

This camp for older writers, aged 11-14, is designed to decode Shakespeare's language, structure, and rhythm in a way that is fun and relatable. By using the anchor text from *No Fear Shakespeare*, campers will see example sonnets, and then they will craft their own sonnets based on their favorite songs, objects, and people in their everyday lives. Sonnets were meant to not only be read, but heard by an audience. At the Third Coast Camp for Young Writers at Western Michigan University, "all of the world's a stage" for your creative voice!
