

Verification of Student's 2014 IRS Income Tax Information for the 2015-2016 Academic Year

Your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called "Verification." The law says that before awarding Federal Student Aid, we may ask you to confirm the information you reported on the FAFSA. In this process, Appalachian State University's Office of Student Financial Aid will compare information from your FAFSA with the financial documents you are required to submit. If there are differences, in most cases we will be able to send the corrections electronically to the federal processor to have your information reprocessed.

To determine the documents you must submit to complete verification, check your financial aid requirements by logging into your AppalNet account and clicking on the "Financial Aid" tab.

You should complete verification as soon as possible, so that your financial aid won't be delayed. Please carefully read and follow the directions in this document, on your AppalNet account and on all other forms you have been requested to submit. If you have questions, please contact our office.

We must receive and review the requested information, under the financial aid program rules (34 CFR, Part 668).

Student's 2014 IRS Income Tax Information

TAX RETURN FILERS – If you have filed or will file a 2014 federal income tax return with the IRS, please read carefully the instructions below.

The best way to verify your tax information is by using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool that is part of FAFSA on the Web. You should go to www.fafsa.ed.gov, log into the FAFSA, click on "Make FAFSA Corrections" and navigate to the Financial Information section of the form. In most cases, for electronic filers, the IRS Data Retrieval Tool is available within 2-3 weeks after the 2014 IRS income tax return has been accepted by the IRS. For filers of paper tax returns, the IRS Data Retrieval Tool is available within 8-11 weeks after the 2014 paper IRS income tax return has been accepted by the IRS.

If you choose not to, or are not eligible to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, you must submit a signed Tax Return Transcript. The Tax Return Transcript must be requested directly from the IRS. By going to www.irs.gov/transcript and setting up an account and answering a series of questions, the transcript can be printed or saved as a PDF. The IRS Tax Return Transcript can also be requested by calling 1-800-908-9946. Make sure to request the "IRS Tax Return Transcript" and not the "IRS Tax Account Transcript." Use your Social Security Number and date of birth and the address on file with the IRS (normally this will be the address used on the 2014 IRS income tax return). In most cases, for electronic filers, the IRS Tax Return Transcript may be requested from the IRS 2-3 weeks after the 2014 IRS income tax return has been accepted by the IRS. For filers of paper tax returns, the IRS Tax Return Transcript may be requested within 8-11 weeks after the 2014 paper IRS income tax return has been accepted by the IRS. Be sure to sign the Tax Return Transcript.

SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES

- If you filed, or will file, an amended 2014 IRS tax return, you must submit a signed copy of the 2014 IRS original tax return or a 2014 Tax Return Transcript and a signed copy of the amended 2014 IRS 1040X that was filed with the IRS.
- If you were a victim of identity theft and are therefore unable to obtain a 2014 IRS Tax Return Transcript or use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, you must contact the IRS at 1-800-908-4490. Upon authentication of the tax filer's identity, the IRS will provide, by U.S. Postal Service, a printout of the tax filer's 2014 IS income tax return information.
- If you will not and are not required to file a 2014 income tax return, please complete page 2, section A and submit to the Financial Aid Office.
- If you were granted a tax filing extension by the IRS, please complete page 2, section B and submit to the Financial Aid Office.
