General Information

The Fast Track Academy is a joint partnership between Wallace State and local school systems. The Academy offers high school juniors and seniors an opportunity to simultaneously enroll in secondary and postsecondary coursework on the campus of Wallace State. The courses meet state requirements for high school graduation while also providing the general education requirements for the certificate and associate degree programs. Students will be enrolled full-time at the high school on the community college campus. The Fast Track Project Director and staff will supervise students and monitor academic progress. Students who are enrolled in the Fast Track Academy may still participate in their home school's extracurricular activities, including athletics, band, and student organizations. Student schedules will be predetermined based on program of study and Alabama high school graduation requirements. WSCC Fast Track Academy will make every effort to schedule courses between 8:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Monday thru Thursday. Exceptions to this schedule will only be made for students with conflicting requirements at the high school or for students needing classes not offered during that time period.

Admission Requirements:

Once students have completed their part of the Fast Track Academy Application, they are to submit it to their counselor. The school administration will then recommend the student for the program if the student has met all necessary criteria. The counselor will complete the remainder of the application and submit it along with an official high school recommendation, transcript, a copy of the student's test scores, and the Graduation Requirements Check List form to Fast Track Academy.

Application Due Date:

Fast Track Application Deadline—April 17, 2015 (Student to complete pg. 1 of 4 page application packet & return packet along with ACT test scores or COMPASS placement scores to high school counselor office).

Application Packets due to Fast Track Academy—May 1, 2015 (submitted by high school counselor) (high school counselor will submit application packet with attached high school transcripts and test scores).

Applications received after the deadline will only be considered if a spot is available.

General entry qualifications will include the following:

- Must take a 12-15 college credit hours per semester depending on high school and degree requirements.
- GPA of 3.0 or higher
- ACT score of 20 or higher in math and English or a comparable score on the COMPASS placement exam
- Minimum of 12 high school credits coming in as a junior
- Minimum of 18 high school credits coming in as a senior
- Passed required end of course exams (if applicable)
- High school junior or senior

Cost of program:

Students pay college tuition. Tuition information may be found at www.wallacestate.edu/Future-Students/Tuition. Books will be furnished in a similar manner as high school programs. Consumable workbooks, lab manuals, published notes, online access codes, general supplies, etc., will be the responsibility of the student. Graduation fee \$60.

The Admissions office will need the signature page (residency form) along with a copy of your drivers license, and a copy of your ACT test scores if applicable. If you do not have ACT test scores or an ACT score of 20 or above in the English and Math section, the Compass placement test will be required

An unofficial copy of your high school transcript and a copy of your ACT or COMPASS scores go to the Extended Learning Department (Fast Track / Dual Enrollment Office), 9th Floor, JBC building.

What is the COMPASS Placement Test?

The COMPASS Placement Test is a computerized assessment of skills in mathematics, reading, and writing. The test uses a multiple choice format, and there is NO “pass” or “fail” grade; instead, the COMPASS is simply a tool used to measure students’ readiness for college level courses and to help place them in classes that correspond to their individual skill levels, either college-level courses or courses to prepare them for college-level courses.

When can I take the COMPASS?

Regular Testing Hours:

8:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. Monday – Thursday
8:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. Friday **by appointment only**

Extended Testing Hours:

8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Every second Tuesday of each month **by appointment only**

Summer Testing Hours:

8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Monday – Thursday (June and July only)

Where do I go?

8th floor, James C. Bailey Center

*Please note the application for enrollment to Wallace State must be completed and on file in Admissions **before** testing.

What should I bring?

A driver’s license or other form of identification

Scratch paper, pencil, and calculator for math calculations

NO notes or books allowed

How long will it take?

The test is not timed, but individuals should allow approximately 2 hours for completion. The COMPASS is an adaptive test, so that means if a question is answered correctly, the next question will be harder. However, if the question is answered incorrectly, the next question will be easier. **In essence, the more knowledgeable a person is, the longer the test will take.** Remember the goal is to be placed as accurately as possible based on individual skill level.

When will I know results?

Results are generated automatically when you finish the assessment. Immediately upon completion and before leaving the testing center, you will know your test scores which are then used to ensure accurate placement in English, reading, and math courses.

May I test more than once?

Yes. There is an \$10 fee to take the COMPASS once more. You will need to pay the cashier and bring your receipt to the computer lab.

How can I prepare?

In preparation for the COMPASS, it is best to become familiar with the types of questions and concepts on the test. However, it is important to remember these are only reviews; the goal of the COMPASS is to assess your *current* skill level.

Why should I prepare?

By preparing for the COMPASS, you increase the likelihood of a better score which can affect the following:

- The number of English and math classes you are required to complete.
- The amount of time and money you will spend to obtain your degree.
- The start-time for taking required classes for your specific major.

Do I have to take the COMPASS?

A student is exempt from taking the COMPASS placement test if any of the following conditions apply:

- You have taken the ACT and scored a 20 or better in the individual areas of math and English
- OR-**
- You have taken the SAT and scored at least 470 on the writing or 470 on the math, and you are enrolling with 3 years of high school graduation
 - You are transferring college-level English and math courses with a grade of “C” or better
 - You have completed required developmental coursework at another Alabama College System institution within the last 3 years
 - You can provide documentation of assessment (COMPASS or ASSET) within the last 3 years
 - You already have an Associate’s Degree or higher
 - You are not seeking a degree but are taking classes for personal enrichment only
 - You are an audit student
 - You are a transient student

I, the undersigned, hereby promise to pay Wallace State Community College the deferred balance as shown in the above calculation by the due date specified herein below. I understand that the amount includes a deferment fee of \$40.00.

I further understand and agree that the balance of my account may be adjusted from time to time to reflect additional charges and/or credits.

I also understand and agree that failure to make the required payment in full on or before the due date specified will result in Wallace State Community College taking one or more of the following actions against me: (1) I will be evicted from Wallace State Community College housing at midpoint of the term; (2) and I will be ineligible to graduate or receive grade reports, transcripts, or future deferments. (3) I will be subject to late payment charges or an administrative handling fee. (4) My account may be turned over to a collection agency.

I hereby further agree and acknowledge that:

- 1) The amounts stated above are subject to correction for any errors contained therein, and I am responsible for the correct amounts as required by the current State Board of Education and Wallace State Community College policies.
- 2) I understand if at any time after the date the deferred amount is due, Wallace State Community College has in its possession or under its control any funds payable to me, whether from financial aid, scholarships, payroll check, or any other source, I authorize that all sums necessary to pay this deferment, my student account balance, and any collection costs may be deducted from such sums.
- 3) I have read and will comply with the regulations of Wallace State Community College in regard to the payments specified in this contract.
- 4) In the event that Wallace State Community College shall be compelled to take appropriate legal or administrative action due to my failure to comply with this agreement, I will be responsible to Wallace State Community College for the reimbursement to the college of any and all costs incurred by the college in the collection of monies due hereunder, including attorney's fees and other reasonable and necessary costs and charges.
