DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. ESSAY CONTEST Theme: Making Lives Matter "Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter."

Building on Dr. King's passion and leadership, students are asked to creatively express how to realize the dream of making lives matter – in their own life and in others' lives. Students should reflect on Dr. King's legacy of service to explore innovative approaches to positive social change.

Who May Apply? All 4-12th grade students are eligible to participate in the essay contest.

Requirements:

- Participants must be enrolled in a Kentucky school.
- The essay should be inspired by a Dr. King moment or speech and how it has influenced the student's thoughts on the theme: **Making Lives Matter**
- Entries must be **500 words or less** on standard 8-1/2" x 11" white paper with 1" margins, double spaced, and in no creative font (Arial and or/New Times Roman are recommended).
- Videos, films, drawings, etc. will not be accepted.

All writing entries will be judged on the criteria listed in the Kentucky Writing Scoring Rubric: **purpose**, **awareness of audience**, **idea development**, **organization** (sentence structure and transitions), **language** and **correctness**.

Awards: Contest winners will receive a personalized plaque. **Note:** First, second and third place winners will be selected in each school grade from 4-12th.

EXTENDED Deadline: Entries <u>must be received</u> (not postmarked) in the Governor's Office of Minority Empowerment no later than close of business on Monday, November 30, 2015.
