Who May Apply? All K-12 students are eligible to participate in the artwork contest.

Requirements:

- Participants must be enrolled in a Kentucky school.
- Artwork should be inspired by a Dr. King moment or speech and how it has influenced the student's thoughts on the theme: **Making Lives Matter**
- Entries must be accompanied by completed work sample index.
- If the return of the CD or DVD is desired, please enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope in which the disk will fit.

All visual art and media entries will be judged on the following criteria:

- Creativity and originality: artwork reflects a unique style or expression.
- Theme: artwork addresses the theme of the contest.

Please note: The selection will be based solely on the artwork; no written essay is required.

Awards: Contest winners will receive a personalized plaque.

Note: First, second and third place winners will be selected in two-dimensional and media arts for each school grade from K-12.
