

# 2015 Call for Presentations

The call for presentations is open May 15 - July 24, 2015 Conference date: Friday, December 4, 2015, 9am-5pm (EST)

Learning Ally is inviting presentation submissions for **Spotlight on Dyslexia 2015**, the second annual online conference on dyslexia and related learning disabilities for parents, to be held Friday, December 4, 2015. Parents nationwide can participate. The live, online conference will be designed to feature webinar presentations with opportunities for audience engagement, including polls, Q & A and text chat.

**Purpose:** To increase understanding, educate and engage parents and caregivers on important issues related to advocating and raising a child with dyslexia and related learning disabilities.

**Goal:** Better informed and more confident and inspired parents, who can better engage with other parents, the school and their community about dyslexia.

**Attendees:** Parents with a wide range of prior knowledge and backgrounds, from those beginning the journey with a child recently identified with dyslexia, to those with greater experience and a high knowledge level. Many parents will have children with multiple disabilities, and may be dyslexic themselves. The conference also attracts a large number of teachers,

tutors, and therapists who work with families and students, as the information can assist them in their classroom and practice as well.



## 2015 Call For Presentations



As a live online conference, presenters will use their own computer, internet and internet browser, phone and headset from home or office when delivering their presentation on our webinar platform. **Travel to our Princeton**, NJ, office is not necessary for presenters or participants.

This call for presentations is designed to assist you with your proposal submission and to provide our review committee with a standardized format for selecting the most relevant entries. To ensure your submission is valid, please fully complete the submission form on the following pages.

Webinar recordings, PDFs of presentation slides and handouts developed by presenters will be available to registered participants for a limited time after the event, and Learning Ally asks your permission to place these in our permanent archives as well. Learning Ally will offer limited opportunities for joint development of handouts for those who request such assistance, as we find handouts often facilitate parent understanding and improve engagement.

Presenters will not receive compensation, honoraria, nor contact information of registrants. Presenters will have the opportunity to post and share their own contact information. Presenters will receive a deeply discounted rate for online exhibit booths of \$150 and assistance in set-up if required.

Presenters will be required to attend one 1/2 hour online training session on the platform and one 1/2 hour practice session prior to the day of the event. Group training and individual practice sessions will be scheduled at a mutually convenient time.

#### General Submission Procedures

- Submission should be emailed to spotlightdyslexia@learningally.org by Friday, July24, 2015
- Presenters are encouraged to submit **more than one** proposal, as we seek a range of pertinent and current topics for parents
- Proposals with multiple presenters or panelists must be submitted by one designated primary presenter, who is responsible for content and organizing other contributors and participants
- Submissions must use the included MS Word Document or PDF format; files should be saved/named: Proposal\_LASTNAME.doc

#### Review Criteria For All Submissions

All proposals will be reviewed by a committee of Learning Ally staff and members of our Parent Community.

#### Proposal submissions must answer the following questions:

- Criteria 1: How relevant, practical or useful is the proposal topic to parenting needs?
- Criteria 2: What are the presenter qualifications to make this presentation?
- Criteria 3: Has the presenter delivered presentations or webinars?
- **Criteria 4:** Is this a unique or original topic, perspective, or are there unique or original elements of the presentation that are relevant or engaging for parents?





## **Accepted Presentations**

- You will be notified by email by September 16, 2015, as to the status of your submission. If your presentation is accepted, you will be asked to review and confirm the date and time of your presentation.
- If the presentation is accepted, you will be requested to send a headshot for online promotional purposes.
- Materials and handouts for accepted presentations are due by Friday, November 14.

Long Description of This description will be used to evaluate the presentation. Limit to 2000 Presentation characters (with spaces) and include what the audience will learn, how it (Evaluation Criteria 1) applies to parents, relevancy, notable content points, any sources used, etc. This description will be posted on the website if accepted. Limit to 500 **Short Description** characters with spaces (about 3-5 sentences) and include what the audience of Presentation will learn. A format that works well is a paragraph of text followed by bullet (For Publication) points for the learning objectives/outcomes. Identify the level of the presentation for the audience. Note that we **Audience Level** anticipate that most parents will be in the beginning or intermediate level of knowledge. Also note that teachers, tutors, and therapists attend our conference as well. Beginner (child diagnosed within a year or two, limited knowledge) Intermediate (at least 2 years of experience and core knowledge) Advanced (knowledgeable and experienced) Works Well for All Levels
