## Parks and Recreation - Staff Report

**Title:** 2013 Concerts in the Park Season Ending Review

### **SUMMARY:**

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July 12<sup>th</sup> – Waterford Round Up – Opening night started off with a small crowd that grew to over 230 people by half-time. The Congressional Gunfighters of America did two skits with a gun and safety demonstration and stayed for photo shoots after the show. City Staff received positive comments from parents regarding the addition of the gun safety lecture and requested that the troupe return. Code Enforcement Officer was on hand to deal with a mobile vendor who appeared on site without the proper licenses.

July 19<sup>th</sup> – Graffiti Night – A head count of 280 showed an increase of people from opening night. A couple of hiccups with the band having a tire blow out three miles from the park with all of the speaker equipment and a vendor wanting to participate without the proper paperwork but all was resolved and Staff believes we had a smooth show. In the end we had a total of 10 classic cars and 4 motorcycles which produced a nice line-up under the trees. Code Enforcement Officer dealt with another mobile vendor who appeared on site without the proper licenses.

July 26<sup>th</sup> – Community Connections – The event popularity increased with a head count of 496. Staff received positive comments from the main food vendors that not only were they extremely happy with the outcome but would love to volunteer their services again for next year. Vendors appreciated the smaller amount of vendors present which allowed greater profits for their companies. A Lion's Club representative requested a partnership with the Waterford Sabercats for the August 2<sup>nd</sup> event to help further their fundraising cause and negotiations/paperwork were made to accommodate. Staff has received numerous comments from audience/community of their excitement and enjoyment over the Concert series. No issues appeared with mobile vendors.

August 2<sup>nd</sup> – Swinging Summer – The beginning head count started at 319 but more arrived for the half-time entertainment show and City Staff was unable to do another count. City Staff received numerous positive comments on the band and show. The half-time show did have an incident of one of the performers catching themselves on fire. Primary and secondary safety precautions were present. Performer was given first aid and sent to Urgent Care as a follow up. Diagnosis showed first degree burn which means red without blisters and should heal within 5-10 days. Performer was sent home with more ointment and light pain meds and is doing fine.
