

## **Commissioners Publish Gun Violence in Oakland County Report**

At our Annual Meeting, Oakland County Commissioners Marcia Gershenson and Bill Dwyer talked about the public hearings they were sponsoring to get input before proposing recommendations for improved education in gun safety and mental health, and the resources to accomplish these goals. The report is now available at <a href="www.oakgov/boc">www.oakgov/boc</a>. Residents can still offer their comments by clicking on feedback or by calling Dwyer at 248-417-7500, Gershenson at 248-808-1032.

#### **Mental Health**

- > Improve access to mental health care services.
- Promote public awareness to improve understanding of warning signs and risk factors of residents with potential mental health problems.
- > Promote crisis intervention services and use new technology, such as live chat and text messaging.
- Recognize retailers who adopt policies not to sell violent video games.

#### **School Safety**

- > Develop model school safety policy and best practices at federal, state and regional levels.
- Require schools to adopt limited entry procedures and monitor access to facilities.
- > Develop program to teach faculty, parents and students to identify warning signs of at-risk youth.
- Provide direct access to school surveillance and appropriate communication equipment for law enforcement.

#### **Gun Ownership**

- Promote continuing gun safety practices.
- Increase public importance of quickly reporting stolen weapons.
- Promote awareness of buying weapons from registered federal firearms dealers.

#### **Law Enforcement**

- > Improved sharing of databases between federal, state and local law enforcement agencies.
- Consistent input of firearm permit denials by agencies at all levels.
- > Make available databases to conduct instant background checks in private exchanges of firearms.
- Provide tougher penalties for violent gun crimes, and when appropriate, prosecute under federal laws that have greater penalties.

The next step for the commissioners will be implementing these recommendations at the county level and later at the state level.

# Oakland Area member selected for Michigan Women's Hall of Fame

**Judith Levin Cantor**, a member of LWV Oakland Area and a League member for almost 50 years, has been selected for induction into the Michigan Women's Hall of Fame. She is a historian, author, archivist and exhibit curator dedicated to promoting Michigan's history and to furthering awareness of the state's significant Jewish heritage. Judy was and continues to be integral to the revival and preservation of the Jewish Historical Society of Michigan. She has received several awards including being named one of "Eight over 80" in 2010 by Jewish Senior Life of Metropolitan Detroit for her dedication of time and talents to the community.

She is one of 19 women to be honored at the 30<sup>th</sup> Annual Awards dinner of the Michigan Women's Hall of Fame on Thursday, October 17, 2013, at the Kellogg Hotel and Conference Center in East Lansing. Historical honorees include past LWV of Michigan Presidents Katherine Moore Cushman of Dearborn & Detroit and Dorothy Leonard Judd of Grand Rapids, who were two of the "Con-Con Eleven" – women elected delegates to the 1961-1962 Michigan Constitutional Convention.

Another contemporary honoree is Marina von Neumann Whitman, a prominent international economist whose husband is an Ann Arbor League member. She was the first woman on the President's Council of Economic Advisors, became a trailblazer for women on corporate boards, and achieved the highest rank for a woman in the auto industry as Group Vice-president of General Motors.

# **Help needed with Legislative Interviews**

Oakland County residents live in 5 State Senate Districts and 14 State House districts. Of these 19 districts, 2 are shared with LWV Flint Area, 2 with Troy Area (interviews completed), and 15 are solely within OA (3 interviews completed).

Legislative interviews help to establish a relationship with our legislators, which is crucial to future advocacy efforts. The interviews are NOT for lobbying purposes, but help us understand the views of each legislator. LWVMI has provided several questions about issues of interest to the League as well as allowing legislators to indicate issues of importance to themselves.

Two people are needed for each district – one to ask the questions and one to take notes.
