










# Quabbin Tour with New England Triumphs









# Bridge Drive in the Southern and Western Quadrant of NH

# The Bridges

Sawyers Crossing - 1859 – 158'5" long – also known as Cresson Bridge. Used as an advertising tie-in for Chesterfield cigarette's Christmas carton with celebrity Arthur Godfrey

<u>Thompson</u> - West Swanzey - 1832 – 136'10" long – also known as the West Swanzey Bridge

Carlton - Swanzey - approx. 1789 – 67'3" long – a wagon fully loaded with hay was used as a standard for height and width of the opening

<u>Slate Bridge</u> – Swanzey -1862, 142'3" long - named after the Slate family who lived nearby.

<u>Coombs Bridge</u> – Winchester- built in 1837 – 106'6" long – named after original builder and owner, Anthony Coombs

<u>Ashuelot Bridge</u> – Winchester – built in 1858 at 169' long - considered to be one of NH's most elaborate covered brides
