2013: Instructions for Application Process - For selection into the Coordinated Program in Dietetics (CPD) and the Didactic Program in Dietetics (DPD) to begin Fall Semester, Junior-level Curriculum

The Dietetics emphasis at Utah State University prepares students to become Registered Dietitians (RDs). Students receive excellent instruction and experience in clinical nutrition, community nutrition and foodservice management. USU offers two programs in dietetics – the **Coordinated Program in Dietetics (CPD)** and the **Didactic Program in Dietetics (DPD)**. Both are accredited by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND).

Admission to either program (CPD and DPD) requires submission of an application due **FRIDAY, MARCH 1, 2013**. All successful applicants will begin Dietetics coursework the following fall semester. Applicants must indicate their first and second program preferences (CPD or DPD) and why they have ordered them 1 and 2 (see application). Following entry into the Dietetics Program, all students must maintain a GPA of 3.0 or better.

The **CPD** program consists of two remaining years of coursework including a 1,200 hour supervised practice experience integrated into the two years. Students in the CPD program are not able to work >10 hours per week during junior and senior years, and must live in Salt Lake City during fall semester of senior year. After graduating, students in the CPD program are eligible to take the national registration exam to become an RD.

The **DPD** program requires two years of coursework and meets all requirements for application into a supervised internship (approximately 1200 hours) following graduation. The **DPD** program is generally preferred by students who must work >10 hours per week, who are athletes, or who choose to complete an internship in another location of their choice. Upon completion of the internship, the graduate is eligible to take the national registration exam to become an RD.

Evaluation Criteria:

Academic Performance - All prerequisite courses must be completed (or in progress) with no D or F grades. A minimum overall GPA of \geq 3.0 is also required. Applicants need to include official transcripts from USU and any other institution(s) they have attended.

Personal Letter of Application - This letter should discuss your interests in the dietetics profession, relevant experiences, short-term and long-term career goals, and any strengths and areas needing improvement.

Dietetics-Related Experience - It is required that applicants have \geq 200 hours when they apply (accumulated in the past 5-year period).

Recommendation Forms - Forms should be completed by 2 professional references (preferably 1 professor and 1 employer -- or 2 professors if an employer is difficult to contact).

Personal Interview - To schedule an appointment for your 15-minute interview, contact the NDFS receptionist in the main office of the NDFS building (797-2126). Interviews will be scheduled <u>during the last week of March</u>.

Math Quiz - Applicants will complete a short math quiz after their interview. Calculators are allowed.

Your completed application packet should include Items 1-4. Items 5 & 6 should be mailed directly to USU Dept NDFS, Attn: Dietetics Selection Committee, 8700 Old Main Hill, Logan, UT 84322-8700. Item 7 should be scheduled and noted.

Leadership Positions / Professional Organization Memberships / Extracurricular Activities (within the past five years) – Please list relevant leadership positions and responsibilities, appointed or elected offices held, professional organizations of which you are a member, involvement in extracurricular activities, and relevant service opportunities.
