USING ALL OF YOUR STRENGTH

A young boy was walking with his father along a country road. When they came across a very large tree branch the boy asked, "Do you think I could move that branch." His father answered, "If you use all of your strength, I'm sure that you can." So the boy

tried mightily to lift, pull and push the branch but he couldn't move it. Discouraged he said, "Dad, you are wrong, I can't do it." His dad said, "Try again." This time, as the boy struggled with the branch his father joined him and together they pushed the branch aside. "Son" the father said, "the first time you didn't use all your strength. You didn't ask me to help."

This is an important lesson. There are many things we can't do alone, but that doesn't mean we can't get them done. Resources that can be mobilized to help us achieve our goals include family and friends. Sometimes we fail to ask for help because of pride or stubbornness. 
PHOTOGRAPHY CLINIC


