philosophy requirement, majors must take six hours from among the following courses: PHIL 4013, PHIL 4023, PHIL 4043, PHIL 4063, PHIL 4073, PHIL 4083. We want to alter this requirement in two ways: first, we want to drop the number of hours to be taken in this series of courses from six to three. Second, we want to add PHIL 4123 to the list of courses that can be taken to satisfy this requirement (which is part of the department's history of philosophy requirement). So we want majors to have to complete THREE hours from PHIL 4013, PHIL 4023, PHIL 4043, PHIL 4063, PHIL 4073, PHIL 4083, and PHIL 4123.

In the past decade, there has been a significant turn over amongst the faculty of the Philosophy Department. While we are still strong in the history of philosophy, our current personnel have, on the whole, greater strengths in other areas. The program as it currently stands is weighted to some extent toward the history of philosophy as opposed to contemporary philosophy. The change we want to make better reflects the teaching and research strengths of the current make-up of the Department. Furthermore, there will still be a very significant history of philosophy requirement for the B.A. Our majors will be required to take a one semester, three-credit upper division course in Ancient Greek philosophy, a one-semester, three-credit upper division course in the 'modern' period (roughly 16th through the 18th centuries), and one other upper-division, three-credit course in another period on the history of philosophy. So a full nine of the 33 hours required for the B.A. in philosophy must be spent on upper division, historical courses.

The course we are adding to the courses that can be used for satisfying the history of philosophy requirement is called "Classical Ethical Theory" and it covers the history of ethics from the ancient Greeks to J.S. Mill in the 19th century. It hadn't been included in the history sequence before because the course is individuated not by the time period it covers (which is the way the history of philosophy courses are otherwise individuated) but by the subject matter it examines. Still, what is taught are historical texts and on further reflection, the faculty unanimously agreed that it should be counted as a history course for the purposes of the history of philosophy requirement.
