Dear Student:

At the closing of this semester, we found that you are not in compliance with Pfeiffer's Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Policy\*. This policy requires (1) that you earn 67% of the total hours attempted and (2) that you meet the GPA required per the Graduate Academic Standing Scale contained in the University Catalog.

As a consequence, you have been placed on "Academic Probation" for the following semester. Since this probation status\* is the direct result of poor academic performance, there is no appeal from this designation. To remain an enrolled student at Pfeiffer University, you must agree to follow an "Academic Study Plan" for the next two semesters.
