Those who work tirelessly for rescue groups and shelters see the day-to-day impact of too many animals being born. My name is Judy Wilson. I retired from John Muir Medical Center in Walnut Creek as an account analyst eight years

why I volunteer

analyst eight years ago and moved to our home in Alta Sierra.

As our senior dogs passed on, it took about three months before we decided we needed to adopt a dog. I called an advertisement about a mixed yellow Lab at one of the adoption centers. Someone called within the day and told me of another Lab mix. They needed an application and a house check (fence), and this is how I met Cheryl Wicks and Carolyn Niehaus. I also adopted Cody, our yellow Lab/Shar-pei (and now a Canine Good Citizen!), from these wonderful ladies. These are the two most compassionate ladies I've ever met.

My passion has always been animals, so when I decided to volunteer I went to the shelter and I knew I would end up bringing all the pets home. So I ventured down the road to AnimalSave and found the greatest people! I began volunteering in the thrift store about a year and a half ago as a cashier, and I love giving time to any part of this organization, I learned.
