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Dear Parents,

I hope you are enjoying a great start to your respective school year. The purpose of this letter is to inform you of steps that Northwest Allen County Schools will be taking to prepare our teachers, who will in return prepare your children, for substantial changes that will be made to the state mandated ISTEP+ and End of Course Assessments (ECA's). Despite the fact that specific information about these changes has not yet been communicated, the changes do go into effect in February beginning with the first part of the ISTEP+ assessment.

As some of you may be aware, the Indiana State Board of Education adopted and communicated new Indiana Academic College and Career Readiness Standards this past April/May 2014. Over the summer, the State Board of Education took steps to align, and therefore change, the ISTEP+ and ECA's with the newly adopted standards. Originally, the changes to the ISTEP+ and ECA's were to take place in the spring of 2016. Because of the Indiana's federal No Child Left Behind waiver, the federal government has mandated that this change take place in the spring of this school year. As of the writing of this letter, we still do not know the specifics of how these changes will be implemented nor have we received specifics on the exact nature of these changes; we expect to receive this information within the next few weeks. Additionally, the State of Indiana has provided zero additional resources in the form of time or monies to train teachers on the changes that are forthcoming. The changes, as they have preliminarily been communicated, are substantial.

In order to prepare our teachers for the changes, so that in return they can prepare your children, Northwest Allen County Schools will be implementing a series of pre-scheduled 2-hour delays. Teachers will receive training, analyze sample assessment questions, and be provided time to make necessary changes to lesson plans so that they can prepare your children for the substantial changes that are forthcoming. I have chosen to pre-schedule these 2-hour delays on Wednesday so that they are least disruptive to your respective schedules as possible. Because of potential weather related interruptions, I will do my best to avoid having delays for this purpose during the second semester; however, additional mandates from the state may necessitate more delays this winter or spring to accommodate more training. At this time, Northwest Allen County Schools will operate on a 2-hour delay schedule on the following days:

> Wednesday, October 8 Wednesday, October 29 Wednesday, November 5 Wednesday, November 12 Wednesday, December 10

I apologize for any inconvenience this may cause to your respective schedules. Our preference would have been to maintain the original timeline for the changes so that this work could occur outside of normal instructional times. However, given the timeline mandated by policy makers and the importance of making sure your children are prepared for the forthcoming changes, we will implement a 2-hour delay schedule on these days. Please watch for communications through your school's newsletters for upcoming information on times that I will be visiting your child's school to provide additional information about changes being mandated by the State of Indiana's General Assembly and State Board of Education.

As always, thank you for your ongoing support of our schools. I continue to be impressed by the commitment that you demonstrate to your child's education. I frequently hear of parents taking time to engage in reading to or with their child each day, supporting their child to learn complex information, encouraging their child to challenge themselves, engaging their child in extended learning activities outside of school, such as visiting museums, state and national parks, cultural events, etc., and many other activities that help children be prepared to learn, achieve, and excel.

Parents of Juniors:

Hopefully you have already registered your junior for the PSAT or ASVAB but <u>if not</u>, please know that juniors not registered for the PSAT will take the ASVAB:

Juniors wanting to take the PSAT should bring their check payable to CHS - or cash - for \$14.00 to the CHS Guidance Office a.s.a.p. While the deadline to be assured of a test was Fri., Sept. 26, we will continue to register juniors for the PSAT until all the ordered tests are "spoken for". Juniors that don't register in time for the PSAT will automatically be registered for and take the ASVAB (military sponsored career/aptitude test). All sophomores and juniors will be involved in one of these college/ career planning tests on the morning of Wed., Oct. 15 as all freshmen and seniors are involved in class specific activities. It is to your child's advantage to choose the test that best suits their needs. The PSAT is especially important for college-bound students and only those scores from a student's junior year are eligible for inclusion in the National Merit Scholarship contest. It is highly recommended that juniors take the PSAT this year, even if it was taken last year as a sophomore. The PSAT is designed not only to prepare a student for the SAT but also to give insight and suggestions regarding a student's ability for college level and Advanced Placement class work. Scores on the SAT are used for college admission decisions and sometimes for college course selections so improving SAT scores is important. If your child is going directly into the work force, apprenticeships, technical training or the military after high school then the ASVAB may be a better option. The ASVAB can provide valuable information in aptitude, skills and career interests. The ASVAB if free and information is not shared with military without parent release/request. College Application Procedure

- 1. Apply online through College websites.
- 2. Create account with Parchment.com & request transcript to be sent to colleges you apply to.
- 3. The counselor portion & transcript will then be completed & sent to these colleges by Mr. Cross or Mrs. Koerner.
- 4. Make sure you are aware of the application deadlines. Your application needs to be completed at least a week before the deadline.
- 5. If you need a recommendation to go along with your application, choose someone who knows you well, tell them what it is for, and give them <u>at least a week</u> to complete it.
- 6. If you are in the Career/Internship Program, add that to your application if possible and explain what it is, how it works, and how it has benefited you. Some colleges may look at your transcript and see an Internship listed but not really know what it is all about.

End of Course Assessments (ECAs)

The state of Indiana released the 2013-14 ISTEP+ End of Course Assessment (ECA) scores for last spring & summer and these test results were mailed to parents/ guardians. The test results are independent of student's grades in the class(es) taken and therefore do not include performance in a classroom situation. The Algebra I ECA is the math portion of the Graduation Qualifying Exam (GQE) and the English 10 ECA is the English portion of the Graduation Qualifying Exam (GQE). If a student did not pass, s/he will have another opportunity to test this school year. Retesting will occur approximately the first two weeks of November and May. Students currently enrolled for the 1st time in English 10 & Algebra I will take the ECAs the 2nd week of May. Biology I ECA will be the first week of May. Please contact your child's Guidance Counselor or Mr. Bitting with questions.

ACADEMIC LETTER GUIDELINES

Academic letters reward students who excel academically and maintain an attendance rate of 95% or better. Students will be awarded their academic letters at the annual Honors Programs.

The letter will be designated "Academics". The chevron may be designated with a symbol or pin. Students are eligible at the conclusion of their 3rd high school semester.

The student's cumulative GPA must be 10.5 or better based upon their 3rd, 5th and 7th semester. The student's attendance must be 95% or better for the calendar year. This means no more than nine (9) absences for the calendar year.

It is the student's responsibility to be accountable to the intention and spirit of the standards of the athletic code and the co– and extra-curricular code of conduct. Participation by otherwise qualified students in activities that violate the athletic and/or coand extra-curricular codes printed in the student handbook will be grounds for ineligibility to receive the academic letter.

Students meeting these criteria for a second time earn a chevron. The maximum number of academic letters a student can earn is three (3) (one letter and two chevrons).

Academic letter qualifiers will be notified of such by their guidance counselor. Academic letters and chevrons will be awarded at the Spring Honors Program. Students select and purchase their own jackets or sweaters for displaying the letters and chevrons.

Attendance

(CHS - 637-7064, CFC - 338-5363)

Regular school attendance is important for the success of your son/daughter in school. At the high school level, a tremendous amount of information is supplied to students each day. If a student misses one class, he or she may fall behind in that subject for an entire unit. If a student misses frequently, he or she is constantly playing catch up. For optimal success in a high school academic program, regular attendance is vital. We ask that you stress the importance of promptness and regular attendance. It is our belief that by doing this you will be teaching them honesty and responsibility, which will accompany them throughout their life.

We understand that there are situations that make it necessary for your son/daughter to be absent from school; however, we hope that you, as parents, do all you can to encourage good attendance. As a reminder, NACS has approved a new attendance policy that allows for 10 absences for the school year. Any and all absences count towards the 10 absences. Those first 10 absences require a phone call from a parent/guardian (so we know that your student isn't truant) and can be for any reason. Continue to bring in medical verification notes from your Doctor. We will want to know if there are medical reasons so we can be aware of those on-going concerns. <u>After 10 days, your student must have an appropriate note verifying that they were seen in the office for an appointment (medical, legal, etc.)</u>. In addition, students arriving to school late, but before 8:15 will NOT be counted absent (does not count towards the 10 absence total). This is a separate category (Late To School) that can be excused with appropriate verification (same as above). The same is true for leaving school early (Early Release) but after 2:30. Each of these events has their own set of consequences if not appropriately verified.

ATTENTION PARENTS

Please note the following in regards to family vacation absences:

*Homework is due prior to leaving or the day the student returns.

*Assessments must be made up no later than the first day of the student's return to school.

*A form should be filled out prior to leaving on the family vacation. Forms can be found in the attendance office.

Appointment Reminder

Whenever a student must miss school due to a medical appointment (or any other type of appointment), please remember that the expectation is that the student will attend school prior to and will return to school immediately after the scheduled time of the appointment. We will be reasonable regarding drive time. If the family wishes to buy the student lunch before returning, please know that we cannot excuse a "sit down", restaurant type of lunch but will excuse drive through. This has nothing to do with the choice of eating establishment but everything to due with returning to school in a timely manner.

Student Vacation Days

NACS does not have school on the day before Thanksgiving and the Friday before spring break. This change in the calendar was made due to high student absenteeism on those days since many of our school families travel at those times of year. We request that when planning family vacations for this coming school year, <u>please do not extend these school breaks</u>. We need your help as parents in order to maximize education for your child and maintain an excellent attendance rate in our school.

Family/Vacation Days

No Family Days should be taken the last five days of the semester.

No family days should be taken during ECA testing (<u>approximately</u> first 2 weeks in November and first 2 weeks in May)



Wednesday Mornings

Teachers attend collaboration meetings every regular Wednesday morning from 7:35—8:15 a.m. Students are not allowed throughout the halls during that time. School does not start until 8:30 a.m. on Wednesdays. Please note: **STUDENTS NOT RIDING THE BUS ON WEDNESDAY SHOULD NOT ARRIVE AT SCHOOL BEFORE 8:15 A.M**. Your help with this is greatly appreciated by the Carroll High School faculty. In case of a delay on a Wednesday, the collaboration time is canceled and school starts at 9:50 a.m., the normal 2-hour delay start time. On a normal Wednesday, all Northwest Allen County School buses run approximately 30 minutes later than on other days.

Parking Permits

Parking Permits will be sold in the fall at the cost of \$30.00 for the school year. Families wishing to register a second car for a student will be charged \$20.00 for each additional vehicle. <u>To purchase a</u> <u>Parking Permit the student will need the original Bureau of Motor Vehicles registration, their</u> <u>driver's license, and their signature for each permit</u>. All student parking is restricted to the student parking lot for all events & classes with entry at new Door 13. This includes all athletic practices, music, art, drama, choir, dance, FFA or any other event or activity Monday thru Sunday.

To Friends and Family of the Carroll Community:

It is a long standing Carroll High School tradition for the senior class to present a gift to a family or organization who has touched the Carroll Community in a special way. The Class of 2015 takes this responsibility seriously as we have the opportunity to make a difference in the life of a deserving individual. The graduating Class of 2015 has chosen freshman student Wil Wigge as this year's gift recipient.

Wil was born with multiple birth defects, which has led to Wil being wheelchair bound. Wil was also born with a severe hip dysplasia. To this day, his right hip is permanently dislocated and can sometimes cause discomfort. There are several medical issues that the Wigge family has dealt with over the years; however the pressing one at the moment is Wil's wheelchair. The wheelchair is falling apart and does not give comfort to Wil's dislocated hip. One wheel cannot come off, which makes transportation difficult. The spokes are breaking, bolts and screws are coming out and are stripped, and only one brake works on the current wheelchair. Wil has had this chair for five years and his body has changed. The wheels are set too high and Wil now has calluses and ulcers on his elbows from rubbing on the wheels as he rolls himself around. Aside from all of the physical and medical setbacks, Wil is an ordinary 14 year old boy. He is very social and loves hanging out with his friends. Wil is determined to be as independent as possible and wheel his chair around himself.

The Class of 2015 and student body of Carroll High School needs your help to get Wil a new wheelchair. We are welcoming monetary donations and merchandise. Any merchandise will be used for a silent auction on February 20, 2015. We thank you in advance for your contribution and for supporting Wil Wigge.

2014 CHS Semi-Formal Dance



Come join us for the annual 10-12 Winter Semi-Formal Dance on Saturday, November 15th, 2014, from 8 p.m. – 11 p.m. Tickets for the event are \$12 and will go on sale to seniors November 3rd, juniors and seniors November 5th, and sophomores, juniors, and seniors November 7th.

The Semi-Formal is a ticketed event and is for grades 10-12. The freshman semi-formal is held concurrently in the freshman cafeteria. No freshmen or middle school students will be allowed into the 10-12 dance. Outside students from other schools and CHS graduates may attend, but they must submit a permission application and a copy of a valid driver's license. The age limit is 20 years old.

This dance is very popular and sells out quickly, so get your tickets early to reserve your spot on the dance floor!

Gentlemen should wear a dress shirt and a tie or a sweater. Dress slacks are required. Ladies may purchase a dress specifically for Semi-Formal, but it is not a requirement. Freshman Semi-Formal

The Freshman Semi-Formal will be held in the CFC Cafeteria on Saturday, November 15, 2014 from 7:00-10:00 PM. <u>A limited number of tickets will be sold</u> beginning on Monday, October 27 at a cost of \$12.00 per ticket. Ticket sales will occur at lunch and will run until they sell out, or through Friday, November 7.

The Freshman Semi-Formal dance is a ticketed event that is limited to freshman and sophomores at Carroll High School only. No middle school students will be admitted to this dance. 


