Scheduling For 2014-2015

Current 8th graders and their parents should mark their calendars for the orientation meeting that will be held the night of Monday, February 10 in the CHS large auditorium and a curriculum showcase at the Carroll Freshman Center (snow date is Wednesday, Feb. 12). Classroom presentations at each middle school will be scheduled to occur following that orientation meeting. Counselors will be making class presentations to current 9th-11th graders during the last week of January and 1st week of Feb. Students will select courses, obtain teacher recommendations and parent signatures AND complete their online course selections by Feb. 13. (Incoming Freshman have until Feb. 21) All students will receive a copy of the new course description handbook and it will be available online at

NACS website: www.nacs.k12.in.us. Parents and students should review that handbook closely for new courses, prerequisites, recommendations and grade weighting. Students will receive more information regarding selecting courses online during the class presentations. Students that do not complete their course selections by the end of the day February 13th (Incoming Freshman by Feb. 21) may have courses chosen for them and/or not be allowed schedule changes if requested. www.may.schedule changes should be made prior to May 1st and changes will be honored IF class sizes allow. Students and parents should review grades at the end of each semester to make certain that course prerequisite, grade recommendations and diploma requirements continue to be met. It is critical that students and parents take this course selection experience seriously. Students' academic preparation for future high school courses and post-secondary (life after high school) opportunities depend on foundation courses and performance. Carroll High School is committed to students taking the most challenging courses appropriate to their abilities and career plans. It is also important for students and parents to understand that staffing and scheduling for the following year is driven by these course requests. Each year all students receive infor-

mation for "high school to post-secondary planning" coordinated by their guidance counselor. During the freshman year, planning sessions are held individually or in small groups and include developing a 4-yr plan. In subsequent years the information is distributed via home rooms and during the scheduling presentations. This helps students move through the growth and research process as they match their interests with their strengths and needs. Students and counselors monitor transcripts relative to diploma types and consider career plans so that high school courses are chosen appropriately. It is also important that students begin their college research early to determine individual college admission requirements. In general 4 year colleges require at least the Core 40 curriculum and often require additional math and world languages. Certain colleges dictate major-specific admission requirements. CHS strongly recommends that capable students strive

for the Core 40 with Academic Honors to more fully meet college admission requirements.



As we near the end of fall weather, I wanted to take this opportunity to remind all of us of procedures regarding school closings and delays.

Question: What are the delay options that will be considered in order to prevent make-up days?

Answer:

Either 2-hour or 3-hour delays could be implemented. Please refer to information from your respective school in terms of starting and ending times for a 2-hour delay schedule and a 3-hour delay schedule. If you have not already done so, please develop alternate plans for child care. Alternate child care plans should accommodate the possibility of (a) school closing for the entire day, (b) the implementation of a 2-hour or 3-hour delay schedule, and (c) the early closing of school. The ultimate decision of whether school will be closed, delayed, or closed early is based on whether our buses can safely transport students on NACS roads.

Two-hour delays are the most commonly used delay option because the State of Indiana requires a minimum number of days and a minimum number of minutes per day. A 2-hour delay complies with Indiana's emergency situation daily minimum minute requirement.

If a 3-hour delay is implemented, which is possible in order to reduce the number of needed make-up days, an additional hour must also be added to the end of the day. This additional hour at the end of the day is required in order to comply with Indiana's emergency situation daily minimum minute requirement.

It is extremely rare that school will be closed prior to the scheduled end of the school day. However, if weather conditions warrant closing school early, then school could be closed as early as 1:00 p.m. This option will be used only if extreme weather conditions jeopardize the ability of NACS to safely transport students to their homes/bus stops at the end of the day. If school is closed early on the same day that began with a delay schedule, then the state does not count the day towards complying with the 180-day minimum requirement.

Question: How are decisions about delay schedules and school closings determined?

Answer:

The ultimate decision of whether school will be closed or delayed is based on whether our buses can safely transport students on NACS roads. The buses purchased by our school corporation maximize the various safety features to insure the safest possible transporting of our students. Likewise, our bus drivers participate in ongoing training opportunities to increase the likelihood of safe driving in various road conditions. Our buses and bus drivers must demonstrate proficiency at meeting Indiana State Police expectations on an annual basis. Despite the safety features of our buses and the training that our drivers receive, there are some road conditions that are not conducive for safe transporting of students. Typically, ice, drifting snow, and reduced visibility are the primary reasons for delays and closings.

Each morning between 4:30 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., road and weather conditions are monitored. At least three NACS employees are driving NACS roads to determine actual road conditions. Each of us drives on roads in different parts of the district so that a picture of the entire district is developed. I also monitor weather reports from multiple sources.



Question: Why do all of the school closings have to be made up?

Answer:

The reason each school closing results in a make-up day is to comply with Indiana law. The expectation from the State of Indiana is that school will be in session for a minimum of 180 days.

Question: Can we extend each day a few minutes in order to make-up school closings?

Answer:

No. In addition to being open a minimum number of minutes each day, Indiana law requires that schools must be open for student instruction a minimum of 180 days. To allow the lengthening of school days to serve as an option for making up school closings, a change in current law is required.

Questions: Will Saturdays be used for making up school closings?

Answer:

No. I did consider and investigate this option a few years ago. However, because of SAT and ACT test administrations, lego league/robotics team competitions, academic team competitions, speech and debate team competitions, band and choir contests, FFA and 4-H participation and competitions, culinary arts competitions, little league participation, Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts activities, IHSAA tournament games, track meets, tennis and golf matches, baseball and softball games, and numerous other activities scheduled on Saturdays throughout March, April, May, and June, I will not recommend the implementation of Saturday school for the purposes of making up emergency/weather related school closings.

Q. Will graduation be rescheduled?

Answer:

If the number of make-up days required by the State of Indiana extends beyond the current graduation date, then yes, graduation will be rescheduled so that all students can meet Indiana's attendance requirements and Indiana's graduation requirements before the ceremony. Our currently scheduled last day of school is May 30 and our currently scheduled date of graduation is June 8.

Q. Have steps been taken to reduce the need for extending the school year beyond the currently scheduled last day of school?

Answer:

Yes. The 2013-2014 NACS calendar includes four potential make-up days within the school year (one potential make-up day on December 20, one on February 24, one on March 14, and one on April 18). If these make-up days are not needed, then these days will be treated as holidays. However, if the number of required make-up days exceeds the number of built-in days, then yes, the school year will be extended beyond the currently scheduled last day of school in order to comply with Indiana's attendance laws.

Attendance

Regular school attendance is important for the success of your son/daughter in school. At the high school level, a tremendous amount of information is supplied to students each day. If a student misses one class, he or she may fall behind in that subject for an entire unit. If a student misses frequently, he or she is constantly playing catch up. For optimal success in a high school academic program, regular attendance is vital. We ask that you stress the importance of promptness and regular attendance. It is our belief that by doing this you will be teaching them honesty and responsibility, which will accompany them throughout their life.

We understand that there are situations that make it necessary for your son/daughter to be absent from school; however, we hope that you, as parents, do all you can to encourage good attendance. As a reminder, NACS has approved a new attendance policy that allows for 10 absences for the school year. Any and all absences count towards the 10 absences. Those first 10 absences require a phone call from a parent/guardian (so we know that your student isn't truant) and can be for any reason. Continue to bring in medical verification notes from your Doctor. We will want to know if there are medical reasons so we can be aware of those on-going concerns. After 10 days, your student must have an appropriate note verifying that they were seen in the office for an appointment (medical, legal, etc.). In addition, students arriving to school late, but before 8:15 will NOT be counted absent (does not count towards the 10 absence total). This is a separate category (Late To School) that can be excused with appropriate verification (same as above). The same is true for leaving school early (Early Release) but after 2:30. Each of these events has their own set of consequences if not appropriately verified. However, for your student to qualify for perfect attendance, he/she must be in attendance every day, all day, receiving no late to schools or leaving early.

ATTENTION PARENTS

Please note the following in regards to family vacation absences:

- *Homework is due prior to leaving or the day the student returns.
- *Assessments must be made up no later than the first day of the student's return to school.
- *A form should be filled out prior to leaving on the family vacation. Forms can be found in the attendance office.

ONLINE LUNCH DEPOSITS

Online lunch deposits can be credited to your students account in as little as 20 minutes. There is a \$2 fee for online deposits. We will accept Discover, MasterCard & Visa credit and debit cards. We will still gladly accept deposits at the registers in cash and check form. Parents can take advantage of the convenience of online lunch account access at sepadomeyToSchool.com

You will need your students ID number to enroll. This can be found on their ID card, book fee statement, report card or class schedule. There is no fee to access account balances and/or history. You can even transfer funds deposited amongst your students.

Another feature Meal Magic allows is family deposits. You may send in one check for multiple students regardless what school they attend. As before, any balances remaining at the end of a school year will transfer with the student.

PARKING AT CARROLL HIGH SCHOOL

Students are to park in the student lot at all times, regardless of the event, activity, day of the week or reason for them to be at school. All entry for students who drive to our campus is to be at door 13. Parents and patrons needing to park during the day can use the north lot in front of door 1 for entry into CHS 10-12. Parents and patrons needing to enter CFC can enter the lot at the light on Carroll with parking and entry in the CFC lot by door 32.
