WORKSHOPS

Evaluation and Management of Fractured Reservoirs in Conventional and Basement Rocks

Presenter : Dr. Ronald A. Nelson (Broken N Consulting)

This one-day course will cover the basic elements needed in the evaluation of fractured petroleum reservoirs from both an exploration and development point of view. A general sequence of study will be presented as well as the data types needed to complete the study. Techniques presented will emphasize outcrop and subsurface rock data, petrophysical data, rock mechanic principles, and reservoir performance data. A multidisciplinary approach to the study of these reservoirs will be stressed. Participants should leave the course with knowledge of what controls short-term and long-term performance in fractured reservoirs and the types of data necessary to evaluate and manage them.

Geoscientists and reservoir engineers who need to know how fractured reservoirs differ from conventional reservoirs and how to approach their study in a systematic manner will benefit from this course. The various types of fractured reservoirs will be defined with examples. Along with oil and gas industry attendees, participants working with fractured basement reservoirs for ground water and/or geothermal resources will equally benefit from the approaches discussed in this course.

Petrophysics for Exploration and Appraisal of Deep Water Reservoirs

Presenter : Mohamed Hashem (Shell)

Deep water reservoirs present significant challenges that must be overcome for successful economic development. These challenges include drilling (shallow flows and unstable sediments), data acquisition (limited number of wells, difficulties in coring and logging due to poorly consolidated reservoirs), geologic (thin beds, uncertain core data), and mechanistic (fluid sampling and characterization, reservoir compaction, effective permeability, static reservoir temperature), and economic (high capital decisions based on uncertain and limited data). The deep water petrophysicist must meet all of these challenges early in the project development cycle. Getting the right information accurately and early in the exploration campaign leads to improved facilities design and reservoir models needed for development decisions, resulting in better assessment of the project.

This workshop will focus on the above issues, with particular emphasis on integrated formation evaluation required for accurate and timely reservoir description needed for development decisions. Participants will learn about data acquisition, interpretation, and integration issues associated with deep water reservoir exploration and appraisal. They are encouraged to bring their own examples for presentation.

Participants on this one-day trip of Hakone Area will learn about the geological history of volcanos, geothermal systems and the active faults and volcanic rocks forming the reservoirs of many Japanese gas fields. Hakone is a triple volcano composed of two overlapping calderas and seven post-caldera cones. From the western rim of the calderas, there is a panoramic view of Hakone caldera and the central behind the caldera lake Ashinoko. Tanna fault is one of the active faults on the Izu Peninsula, which is left-lateral with a total displacement of about 1 km horizontally and 100 meter vertically. We see the horizontal displacement and the fault plane of the large, shallow hypocenter earthquake of November 26, 1930.

We are planning a brief walking to observe the geothermal manifestations and Hakone National Park.


