### Busy times ahead

A note from Dr. DeYoung

Dear Wines Families,

Here we are, a few days into March, and I again have to say how hard it is to believe how quickly this year seems to be going. While we have come a long way this year, the months ahead are among the busiest for our kids and our staff as we head into the important final third of the year *and* we begin making plans for next year.

#### **Full Day Kindergarten**

Speaking of next year, I am excited to announce that our entire school district is moving to a uniform kindergarten model of full day (free!) kindergarten in all of our elementary schools next fall. If you have a child who is ready for kindergarten and will be 5 years old before Dec. 1, 2012, please make sure you come to the office to register if you haven't done so already.

#### **Staffing for Next Year**

In addition to planning for three sections of full day kindergarten at Wines next year, we are also beginning to examine our staffing arrangements and student placements for grades 1-5 as well. Some time over the next couple of weeks, I will include a survey in my weekly email asking for parent input into class placement decisions for next year. As with last year, we do not accept requests for specific teachers and such requests will not be considered. However, parent input is helpful as we paint a whole picture of our



students and what will be the best fit for each child.

#### **NAAPID**

I want to thank the approximately 240 parents who came and spent part of your day with us during our NAAPID celebration last month. It was a fantastic day all around. I want to thank NYPD Pizza for providing the pizza lunch for the day, and to Inter-State photography for providing our photographer. As soon as we get the pictures back from Inter-State, we will send home a nice memento from the day.

I also want to recognize our staff for their contributions that day. Staff members provided treats for guests, served lunch, supplied flowers, put together our slide show, held special activities in their classrooms, and generally supported this special day. While we highlight the goal for parents to see what a normal day of school is like for their children during NAAPID, if you visited that day, you saw that it is by no means a "normal" day. So I thank our staff for making the day so special and for our parents for taking time to join us.

#### **MEAP Results**

As you know, the Michigan Department of Education recently published the MEAP results from the assessment period this fall. Since much has been in the news lately regarding the expected reduction in the percent of students who meet the new standards for the proficient (Prof.) and advanced (Adv.) ranges, I've included the chart below to show you how Wines students compare with the State.

We will continue to work to increase the number of students achieving in the advanced range as we strive to help all of our students improve. The chart shows the percent of students who are proficient or advanced in reading, math, writing, and science. As

always, I remind everyone that the MEAP, while important, is one of many measures (both formal and informal) that we use to track student growth and inform on our teachers' instruction.

Finally, just a reminder that there is no school on Monday, March 12<sup>th</sup>. Teachers will be working on report cards that day. Report cards will go home with your child on Monday, March 19<sup>th</sup>.

To help you understand each role, the current officers have summarized their duties:

#### President / Co-President

- Oversees the direction of the Wines Parent Teacher Organization
- Sets agendas and runs all PTO meetings (general and executive board)
- Recruits and appoints chairs for Wines committees and events
- Coordinates the work of officers and event committees
- Acts as an ex-officio member of all committees
- Provides input into PTO yearly calendar
- Regularly checks PTO mailbox and distributes mail
- · Helps count money at fundraising events
- Assists with ongoing school programs such as Scholarship and Box Tops
- Acts as the bridge between faculty and families

#### **Vice President**





Food Gatherers annually distributes more than 5.25 million pounds of food to a network of more than 150 local community programs serving our neighbors in need and provides enough food for more than 12,000 meals a day in Washtenaw County. Rotary International is an organization of business and professional people united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build goodwill and peace in the world.

We will gladly accept any non-perishable food you can contribute, but are especially in need of: tuna, peanut butter, canned meats, stew, hearty soup, chili, beans (kidney, pinto, green, black, refried, lima), baby food/formula and Ensure or other nutritional supplement drinks.

We will also accept unopened hotel size soap, shampoo, toothbrushes, toothpaste, as well as diapers.





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
