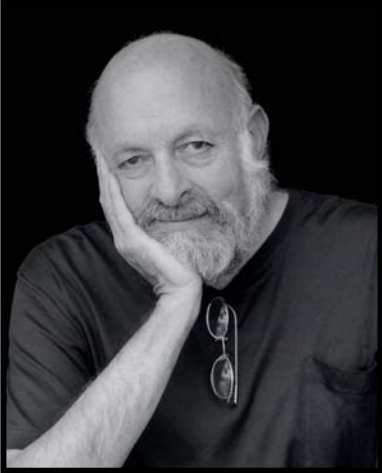


# Please Join Us for the The Affiliates of UCR Luncheon Meeting

## An Inside View of the UCR Barbara and Art Culver Center of the Arts



### Presentation by: Dr. Jonathan Green Executive Director of UCR/ARTSblock UCR Professor of Studio Art & Art History

If you missed the grand opening last month of the UCR Barbara and Art Culver Center of the Arts, now is your chance to get an insider's view of this magnificent facility. An 18 million dollar renovation, funded through a combination of private and public support, has transformed the 19th Century Rouse building into the premier state-of-the-art, interactive arts facility in Southern California. The Culver Center extends the vitality and community interactivity of UCR/ARTSblock by providing new exhibition space; a new home for the Sweeney; an 80-seat film and video screening room; an atrium gallery, music, and performance under a magnificent 35 foot high naturally illuminated clerestory monitor; a public café; a new seismically protected home for the UCR/CMP's world-treasure Keystone-Mast collection, and an advanced faculty and student laboratory for advanced research in the arts. Dr. Green will guide us through this extraordinary transformation and highlight some of the current and upcoming exhibitions.

Jonathan Green is the Executive Director of UCR/ARTSblock, after having served as Director of the UCR California Museum of Photography since 1990. Under Green's leadership, the UCR/CMP has become a major presence in Southern California and the national and international art scene through its touring exhibitions and the strength of its collections. The museum has been recognized and supported by entities such as The National Endowments for the Arts and Humanities, Institute of Library and Museum Services, California Council for the Humanities, Warhol Foundation for the Visual Arts, and the Haynes Foundation. Before coming to UCR, Green taught at MIT and Ohio State, where he was the Founding Director of the Wexner Center for the Arts. Dr. Green's photographs are in museum collections around the world and he has received Photography Fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts and from AT&T.
