Dear Friends,

Lent comes early this year! February 10 is Ash Wednesday. Our Shrove Tuesday Pancake supper will be Tuesday, February 9, and it will not snow this year! We are counting on that. So come, be with us. Then, Ash Wednesday services will be at 12:00 Noon and 7:00 p.m.

Lent is often portrayed as a journey from one point in time to another. It is a time in which we experience the lengthening of days as spring approaches. It is also a time that Christians have set aside every year to embark on a discipline of spiritual growth. Henri J. M. Nouwen, a renowned spiritual writer speaks about the journey of Lent as a discipline that we embark upon as we prepare a place for God. He writes, "Discipline in the spiritual life is a concentrated effort to create the space and time where God can become our master and where we can respond freely to God's guidance. Thus, discipline is the creation of boundaries that keep time and space for God—a time and a place where God's gracious presence can be acknowledged and responded to." The Ash Wednesday Liturgy in our Prayer Book invites us all "to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word." BCP p. 265

I hope that for you, Lent can be a helpful time for you and for me to create afresh in our hearts, in our thoughts, and in our actions a place for God as we contemplate once again what it meant for God to give his Son for us on the Cross. On the five Wednesday evenings beginning on February 17, Epiphany will offer a series of conversations around a book, Lent and Easter, Wisdom of Henri J. M. Nouwen. This is a beautiful book which takes us through the days of Lent and into the first two week of Easter. Each daily reflection begins with thoughts from Henri Nouwen on an appropriate theme for the day supported by a passage from Scripture, a prayer and then a suggested activity for spiritual growth. It is my hope that through these Wednesday evening conversations we can be a supportive community for one another in some helpful way in our journey together this Lent. May our Lenten journey this year at Epiphany be a blessing to us and may we, by our thoughts and our actions and our witness during this holy season be a blessing to others as well.

There has been a price increase; double room occupancy is \$115.00 per person and a single room is \$135. I am hoping that Rev. Kaki Swann will be our facilitator, but I am waiting for final confirmation that she can fit us into her schedule. Kaki filled in for two of the Sunday's that David was on vacation last July and was formerly rector at Copley Parish in Northern Neck. She is also Chip Dunn's (Buddy's son) mother-in-law.

# Stewardship Update

We have received 70 adult and 3 youth pledges this year compared to 75 adult and no youth pledges in 2015. Pledges total: \$191,518 for current expenses versus \$172,722 and \$27,928 building expenses versus \$25,305 for an increase of \$21,419 or 9.1%. Fifty three parishioners took the Epiphany GIFTS Challenge.

The Stewardship Committee wishes to thank everyone for your generous pledge.

This month I wanted to share my GIFTS Challenge blessing. During the Nor'easter this fall our property at the Bay suffered damage from erosion during the storm. Our wonderful landscaper came and gave us an estimate of \$1,500—2,000 for the repairs. The day before Thanksgiving Glen and his crew arrived bright and early with their equipment, two loads of dirt and about 1,000 pounds of armourstone. They spent the entire day working to rebuild and fortify the corner. The bill ended up being \$1,400 and a jar of Mom's homemade peanut brittle. I felt that I should help Daddy with the cost of the repairs so I wrote him a check for \$400.00. The very next day I was called and asked if I had any of the mallet covers I make ready. I had 200 done which comes to…you guessed it \$400. This is a very slow time of the year for the mallet business so it is very unusual that Mr. Jacob ever calls in January for more work. His busiest time is usually right before school band practice starts and just before the holiday parades. God is good all the time and we just need to step out and trust that he will provide all our needs.

On behalf of the Board of Directors of the LAMB's Basket food pantry, I would like to thank you for your generous \$3,155.00 contributions to the food pantry. As you know, our organization is entirely volunteer and we rely on the support of those who care about this worthwhile ministry. # HEARTH of Henrico

On behalf of the Board of Directors of Hearth of Henrico, and the Henrico Department of Social Services, I would like to thank you for your generous contributions in 2015. Your gifts provided much needed support to adults, families and children living in Henrico Country. It is only through contributions made by you and others in the community that HEARTH can continue to provide for those in need when other resources are not available.

This year we provide direct financial assistance to a total of 138 households. Financial assistance was given for a number of different purposes including: eviction prevention, helping families living in hotels obtain permanent housing, providing utility payments intended to help prevent hospitalization or death, supporting children in foster care to attend summer enrichment programs, ensuring a happier holiday by providing gifts for children coming to foster care in the last weeks of December and other one-time purchases for basic needs such as food and clothing. HEARTH is also invested in helping grandparents who are raising grandchildren through its support of the Kinship Care Support group.

HEARTH also sponsored the annual Thanksgiving Food Box Program. This program provided a holiday meal that many would not be able to have otherwise. This year we served 217 households consisting of 634 individuals.

Thank you again for helping to make all of these activities possible. I hope that we can continue to count on your support in 2016 as we continue our vital missions.



### Recipe of the month: Submitted by Diana Stone

#### **Coconut-Cranberry Bars with Pecans**

1 1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs 1 1/4 cups pecan halves 1/2 cup butter, melted 1 cup flaked coconut

1 1/2 cups sweetened dried cranberries 3/4 cup white chocolate chips

1 (14 ounce) can sweetened condensed milk 3/4 cup bittersweet chocolate chips

#### Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line a 9/13 inch baking dish with parchment paper or grease.
- 2. Mix graham cracker crumbs and butter together in a bowl; press into the prepared baking dish.
- 3. Stir cranberries, sweetened condensed milk, pecans, coconut, white chocolate chips and bittersweet chocolate chips together in a bowl; gently spread over the graham cracker crust.
- 4. Bake in the preheated oven until edges are golden brown, 25 to 28 minutes; cool on a wire rack.
