

Among Spain's most internationally celebrated artists is **Francisco Goya**, 1746-1828. Born in Zaragoza, he is known for realistic cultural paintings. His work greatly influenced **Pablo Picasso**, 1881-1973, an inventive painter and sculptor who studied in Barcelona and is credited as the co-founder of cubism. Native to Catalonia are **Antoni Gaudí**, 1852-1926, an architect famous for his unique designs that now embellish the profile of his capital city; and the surrealists **Joan Miró**, 1893-1983, and **Salvador Dalí**, 1904-89.

UNESCO The seven structures built by architect Antoni Gaudí in or near Barcelona (1984, 2005) and the 12th-century Mudéjar Architecture of Zaragoza (1986, 2001) are designated by UNESCO as *World Heritage List*

Educational Focus: *The Romance of Hemingway's Spain.* Discuss Hemingway's interest in Pamplona's Fiesta de San Fermín, described in the classic 1926 novel, *The Sun Also Rises.*

Excursion: *Pamplona.* Stroll along the 16th-century streets of Pamplona, famous for the annual Running of the Bulls in July. See the splendid Gothic cathedral; the Chapel of San Fermín in the Church of San Lorenzo; and the Plaza de Toros, the bullring near the Arga River where the Fiesta de San Fermín ends.

Local Flavor: Lunch is served at a restaurant in Pamplona.

Tonight, attend a *Farewell Reception and Graduation Ceremony* followed by dinner at the hotel.


