

Course of Study and Placement Test Information

Students are required to take one full credit in the area of Fine Arts prior to graduation. We offer a number of options for this requirement to be fulfilled. Students can take courses and/or gain credit through participation in performance-based activities including the school's musical ensembles, choir, dramatic and musical productions. Freshman students are required to take one ¼ credit course. Participation in the Band or Choir fulfills this requirement. Placement tests are required in order to be considered for Geometry or for a second year or advanced status in one of the languages. Placement tests will take place on Saturday, May 8 at 8:30 a.m. Each test should take approximately 45 minutes. If you wish to take a placement test, specify which subject(s) on the enclosed form.

Fine Arts/Language Choice/Placement Test Webinar

We will hold a webinar providing information on the Fine Arts options for freshmen, the selection of a language to study, and the placement test in Mathematics and Language.

What is a webinar?

The word webinar is actually an abbreviation of web seminar. It is basically a seminar or conference conducted over the World Wide Web. You go to a website, log in (with provided information), and listen to a presentation. Depending upon how it is set up, you can participate (by typing questions or comments, using a microphone, or the phone).

Why will this help?

We will present information on Fine Arts choices, language options, and the upcoming placement test. You will have the opportunity to ask questions to assist you in making your decisions.
