FACULTY LETTER OF SUPPORT

A letter of support from your faculty research advisor, including cover sheet, must accompany this application. The letter should address the (1) quality and importance of the project(s) proposed; (2) the ability of the student to pursue the project; (3) the amount of time the student is expected to give to the project this summer; (4) the relation of the project to the sponsoring advisor's research; (5) the source and amount of financial support, if any, the faculty sponsor will provide to the student. A letter of support from your community partner(s) should accompany your project description. This should include a brief description of your planned project and the total hours per week they expect you to be on site.

Preference will be given to projects where there is a close relationship between the student's and the faculty member's research; an important goal of this program is to enrich University of Delaware faculty members' research and creative work.
