Spotlight: Bartlett Roundhouse Preservation Society

Roundhouse The Bartlett constructed in 1887 by the Portland and Ogdensburg Railroad. One year later the P&O was leased to the Maine Central Railroad for 999 years and the Maine Central continued to add on and improve the facilities in 1888 and 1889. This new six stall roundhouse was state of the art at the time. It replaced the older, smaller 1873 P&O Roundhouse which was moved across the tracks and used by the bridge maintenance department for several years. At the height of passenger and freight service on the Maine Central, the roundhouse serviced the helper locomotives that would be assigned to assist the heavy freight and sometimes passenger trains through the rugged Crawford Notch. With the advent of the automobile, freight and passenger service began to decline. With the death of steam on the Maine Central in the mid 1950's the building became



useless and the facilities were closed in 1958 and sold to the state of NH in 1959. The building then became a sand and salt storage depot for the State of NH. The building was open to vandals and considerable damage was done to beams and structure. In 2008 The Bartlett Roundhouse Preservation Society was formed in order to protect the building from demolition and vandalism and to work with the State of NH whom still

owns the building and eventually turn it into a Museum of Railroad Transportation through Bartlett and Crawford Notch. The Society leases Snow Plow #68 and Boxcar 35059 from the Conway Scenic Railroad and has begun restoring the plow with work to begin on the boxcar in the fall of 2015. The Society also hosts an annual Model Railroad show, this year the date is May 17, 2014 at the Bartlett Elementary School in Bartlett Village. 
