Legislative Update

As the Sentinel goes to press for June, before our Chapter two-month summer recess. we have some encouraging things happening on the legislative front, but nothing is a done deal just yet. On the Federal side, the House Representatives of passed the FY2008 Defense Authorization Bill after approving number amendments addressing personnel, pay and benefits issues for the active force and retired members and their The Senate is still families. working their version of the bill, and, of course, any differences need to be addressed in joint committee.

You may remember that last vear the Senate finished first, but amendments included in the Senate version were not included in the House version and were lost in ioint committee action. The fact that the House has addressed these issues this year, albeit not always as much as we would like to see, must be viewed as an improvement over last year.

Two other major efforts on the Federal level, the Task Force on the Future of Military Health Care and the Veteran's Disability Benefits Commission are also still in work with the former due to report out in June of this year. The Task

Force established was by Congress last year to try to get a handle on what to do about the increases in TRICARE and pharmacy costs that were being proposed by DOD. As we stand today, both the House and Senate have gone on record that there will be no increases for these items this fiscal year. So, we will see the issues pushed to next year at the earliest.

On the state level, the Legislature is in their two-week Memorial Day break. It appears they are still on track to complete action on the state budget some time in June. There are over thirty draft bills potentially affecting the state military, Guard/Reserve and veteran communities still resident at committee level. Few of these will make it all the way to law this year. My crystal ball says that we are going to get the final 19 additional Benefit Councilors Veteran funded that were recommended by the Governor's Veterans Task Force from 2005. should get state funding support for the VA Home this year. Would you believe that the state legislature would not provide the legislation that was initially required to start the Home unless it was certified that it self would be sustaining (Federal and private funding only) with no state funding required? No wonder there were problems with staffing the Home that surfaced this year.

On the Federal level addition to heading increases in health care this year, it appears as a minimum we will get a 3.5% increase in military pay (the administration proposed 3%), we will get a funded increase in troop levels (the last one Congress neglected to fund), we will get some improvements in the way w e treat Guard/Reserve contingency. and we will get a nominal (small) improvement to the DIC/SBP offset issue. We are not likely to see implementation date for 30year paid up SBP moved forward to this year from next. We will see how this all plays out, but I firmly believe that your help and all the other veterans help in getting our Congressmen and women's attention on military and veterans issues is truly making a difference.


Memorial Day 2007
