

Making Music

Objective: Design and construct a functioning musical instrument.

Procedures:

1. Brainstorm various types of musical instruments (at least 5).
2. Decide on an instrument that you would like to construct.
Decide on a design and sketch a DETAILED picture of it being sure to label what materials you will be using for each part.
3. Construct your instrument using everyday items. Do not bring in store-bought instruments. It must be entirely made from "scratch." You must actually construct something. You must be able to control pitch and volume.
4. List ALL materials used.

Grading Rubric

1. Brainstorming up to 5 points
2. Sketch of Instrument up to 15 points
(5 points for drawing, 5 for labeling, 5 for accuracy & neatness)
3. Construction up to 75 points
(to receive full credit pitch & volume must be controlled by you, appropriate materials must be used, the instrument must be neat & attractive, instrument must have some extra or special feature)
4. Materials List up to 5 points

Battle of the Bands

Congratulations! You have been selected to participate in the first ever RMS Battle of the Bands! You will work in groups to plan, practice, and perform a simple song using musical instruments constructed by each member. Your band will then be performed, videoed, and judged by your peers and teachers. In addition, your performances will be showcased in a Podcast! Following are rules and guidelines for the event.

You will select your own band members during class today – 3-5 per group please. Your band members will need to be in your science class; instruments must be made by each band member and cannot be purchased (no replicas please). Performances must be school-appropriate. If in doubt, ask your teacher prior to your performance.

Each band must collaborate on:

- ✓ Song choice*
- ✓ Instruments to be used (be sure to have a variety and not replicas)*
- ✓ Instrument each member will construct and play*

When considering your musical instrument, consider the following:

- ✓ Project guidelines (see rubric; reread it prior to beginning)*
- ✓ Type of materials needed*
- ✓ Time limits*
- ✓ How pitch and volume will be controlled*
- ✓ How the instruments mesh with the band's song choice*

Bands will need to plan “jam” sessions outside of class to practice your rendition of the selected song choice (lunch study, before or after school).

Performances should be limit to no more than 2 minutes. Creativity is important in song choice, selection of instruments, and performances.

However, do not forget that this assignment is for a grade, will be videoed and showcased online, and must be taken seriously. Props and costumes encouraged, but optional.

Battle of the Bands

You will receive a 100 point grade for the construction of your instrument (Making Music), and a 50 point grade for your performances (Battle of the Bands).
