international initiative that uses music as a catalyst to support humanitarian efforts in many parts of the globe.

## INTERNATIONAL PEACE DAY, TEL AVIV

Around 250 Palestinians from the West Bank and 1,500 Israelis came to this unique event in the heart of Tel Aviv which presented the fruits of a year's work by the PC-FF women's group – Israeli and Palestinian bereaved mothers, sisters, wives and daughters. There was an art exhibition, a photography exhibition, dialogue encounters, home made foods for sale and a selection of handiworks.

All those taking part called for a change in the current situation and a speedy solution to the long-running conflict.

Highlights of the exhibition included:

#### 'The Presence of the Void' -

An exhibition of photographs created by ten Palestinian and Israeli bereaved women, who embarked on a moving journey to photograph the continuing presence in their lives of the person they had loved and lost.

The project was led by the



professional photographers Vardi Kahana, Atta Awisat and Miki Kratsman. A piece of video art created by the director Nurit Keidar about this exhibition was also presented at the event. The exhibition can be viewed at the Cinemateque until 14th October.

#### 'The Texture of Life' -

An exhibition of 15 handmade books created by Palestinian and

Israeli bereaved women who presented the milestones of their lives in an artistic way. The visitors to the exhibition also read the text that was set next to each book telling the story of the woman who made the book. This project was led by the artist Dvora Morag.



## PARLIAMENTARIANS PUSH FOR PEACE

Israeli and Palestinian negotiators have held a new round of talks. Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas has held a rare meeting with a group of Israeli parliamentarians. He said that this could be the last chance to reach a deal to end decades of conflict and create two independent states living side by side.

A senior Palestinian official told Reuters that the talks were intensifying, with the negotiating teams agreeing to meet for up to eight hours a day and to see one another more regularly than at the start of their latest diplomatic drive.

The delegation of Israeli politicians was from the Caucus for Ending the Israeli-Arab Conflict. They traveled to the Mukata, the Palestinian Authority's headquarters in Ramallah, to meet Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas.

One Voice helped organise the meeting, which followed the successful 31st July visit, where Palestinian officials came to the Israeli parliament.

'The OneVoice Movement was honoured to take part in the making of this unique and historic meeting at the Mukata,' said OneVoice Israel (OVI) Executive Director Tal Harris.

'Each side's commitment to engage in a meaningful dialogue highlights the reality that we are another step closer to making the dream of ending the conflict and the vision of the two-state solution a reality.

'As we move past this event, the OneVoice Movement will continue to leverage our regional grassroots networks to help mobilise civil society and amplify the voice of the moderate majority on both sides.'

OneVoice Palestine (OVP) Executive Director Samer Makhlouf said: 'We are pleased to see the progress being made by the OneVoice Movement's Caucus for Ending the Israeli-Arab Conflict.

'Although headway is being made, both sides must recognise that there are still significant issues to be addressed, primarily the freezing of settlement activities. Our organisation will continue to support the joint work of our government and civil society partners and work with OneVoice youth leaders to support the efforts of President Abbas and lead us on a substantive path toward a two-state solution.'
