Note 2: You may not apply for your husband or wife, if you gained LPR status through a prior marriage to a U.S. citizen or LPR, unless: - 5 years have pass since you became an LPR; OR - You can show though evidence that the prior marriage by which you gained immigrant status was not entered into to evade any immigration laws; OR - Your prior marriage by which you gained your immigrant status was terminated by death. Note 3: You may not apply for your husband or wife, if you married your spouse while your spouse was the subject of an immigration proceeding regarding your spouse's right to be admitted/remain in the U.S., or while a decision of an immigration proceeding was before a court on judicial review, unless: - You can prove through evidence that the marriage is legally valid where it took place, and that your spouse married in good faith and not to procure admission of your spouse as an immigrant, and that no fee or consideration was given for filing this petition; **OR** - Your spouse has lived outside the U.S., after the marriage, for 2 years. Note 4: You may not apply for your husband or wife, if it has been legally determined that your spouse has attempted/conspired to enter into marriage to evade immigration laws.
